A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to a workforce high school diploma program.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 28.0255 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 28.0255. WORKFORCE HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PROGRAM. (a)
7	The State Board of Education, in coordination with the Texas Higher
8	Education Coordinating Board, shall by rule develop a workforce
9	high school diploma program under which students who have not
10	received a high school diploma and who have successfully completed
11	a workforce certificate course of study as described by Subsection
12	(b) may receive a high school diploma as provided by this section.
13	(b) For purposes of this section, a workforce certificate
14	course of study is a sequential course of study of at least 30
15	credit hours in a career and technical education program offered by
16	a public junior college that leads to industry or career
17	certification.
18	(c) In adopting rules to develop the program under
19	Subsection (a), the State Board of Education, in coordination with
20	the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, shall approve a
21	variety of career and technical education programs described by
22	Subsection (b).
23	(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a
24	person is eligible to receive a high school diploma under this

- 2 (1) has not satisfactorily completed the curriculum
- 3 requirements under Section 28.025;
- 4 (2) has satisfactorily completed a workforce
- 5 certificate course of study described by Subsection (b); and
- 6 (3) complies with any additional requirements
- 7 provided by rule by the State Board of Education, in coordination
- 8 with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
- 9 (e) The school district in which an eligible person resides
- 10 shall issue to that person a high school diploma as provided by this
- 11 subsection. The State Board of Education, in coordination with the
- 12 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, shall by rule adopt the
- 13 form and designate the title of a diploma issued under this section.
- 14 The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to authorize school
- 15 <u>districts to issue diplomas to eligible students under this</u>
- 16 <u>section.</u>
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
