- 2 relating to administrative fees assessed when certain charges are
- 3 dismissed.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 502.407(b), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A justice of the peace or municipal court judge having
- 8 jurisdiction of the offense may[+
- 9 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ dismiss a charge of driving with an expired
- 10 motor vehicle registration if the defendant:
- (1) $[\frac{A}{A}]$ remedies the defect not later than the 20th
- 12 working day after the date of the offense or before the defendant's
- 13 first court appearance date, whichever is later; [and]
- 14 (2) [(B)] establishes that the fee prescribed by
- 15 Section 502.045 [502.176] has been paid; and
- 16 (3) pays [(2) assess] an administrative fee of [not to
- 17 exceed] \$20 when the charge is dismissed.
- SECTION 2. Section 502.473(d), Transportation Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (d) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 21 (a) if the defendant:
- 22 (1) shows that the motor vehicle was issued a
- 23 registration insignia by the department that was attached to the
- 24 motor vehicle, establishing that the vehicle was registered for the

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- 1 period during which the offense was committed; and
- 2 (2) pays an administrative fee of \$20 [not to exceed
- 3 \$10].
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 502.475(c), Transportation Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (c) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 7 (a)(3) if the defendant:
- 8 (1) remedies the defect before the defendant's first
- 9 court appearance; and
- 10 (2) pays an administrative fee of \$20 [not to exceed
- 11 \$10].
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 504.943(d), Transportation Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (d) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 15 (a)(1) if the defendant:
- 16 (1) remedies the defect before the defendant's first
- 17 court appearance; and
- 18 (2) pays an administrative fee of \$20 [not to exceed
- 19 \$10].
- SECTION 5. Section 504.945(d), Transportation Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (d) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 23 (a)(3), (5), (6), or (7) if the defendant:
- 24 (1) remedies the defect before the defendant's first
- 25 court appearance; and
- 26 (2) pays an administrative fee of \$20 [not to exceed
- 27 \$10].

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- 1 SECTION 6. Section 521.026(b), Transportation Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b) The judge shall [may] assess the defendant an
- 4 administrative fee of [not to exceed] \$20 when the charge of driving
- 5 with an expired driver's license is dismissed under Subsection (a).
- 6 SECTION 7. Section 521.054(d), Transportation Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) A court may dismiss a charge for a violation of this
- 9 section if the defendant remedies the defect not later than the 20th
- 10 working day after the date of the offense and pays an administrative
- 11 fee of [not to exceed] \$20. [The court may waive the administrative
- 12 fee if the waiver is in the interest of justice.
- SECTION 8. Section 521.221(d), Transportation Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (d) A court may dismiss a charge for a violation of this
- 16 section if:
- 17 (1) the restriction or endorsement was imposed:
- 18 (A) because of a physical condition that was
- 19 surgically or otherwise medically corrected before the date of the
- 20 offense; or
- 21 (B) in error and that fact is established by the
- 22 defendant;
- 23 (2) the department removes the restriction or
- 24 endorsement before the defendant's first court appearance; and
- 25 (3) the defendant pays an administrative fee of \$20
- 26 [not to exceed \$10].
- 27 SECTION 9. Section 547.004(c), Transportation Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (c) A court may dismiss a charge brought under this section
- 3 if the defendant:
- 4 (1) remedies the defect before the defendant's first
- 5 court appearance; and
- 6 (2) pays an administrative fee $\underline{\text{of $20}}$ [not to exceed
- 7 \$10].
- 8 SECTION 10. Sections 548.605(b) and (c), Transportation
- 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The court shall:
- 11 (1) dismiss a charge of driving with an expired
- 12 inspection certificate if:
- 13 (A) the defendant remedies the defect within 20
- 14 working days or before the defendant's first court appearance date,
- 15 whichever is later; and
- 16 (B) the inspection certificate has not been
- 17 expired for more than 60 days; and
- 18 (2) assess an administrative fee of [not to exceed]
- 19 \$20 when the charge of driving with an expired inspection
- 20 certificate has been remedied.
- 21 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(1)(B), the court may
- 22 dismiss a charge of driving with an expired inspection certificate
- 23 that has been expired for more than 60 days. The court shall assess
- 24 an administrative fee of \$20 when a charge is dismissed under this
- 25 subsection.
- SECTION 11. Sections 681.013(b) and (c), Transportation
- 27 Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 1 (b) The court shall:
- 2 (1) dismiss a charge for an offense under Section
- 3 681.011(b)(1) if:
- 4 (A) the vehicle displayed a disabled parking
- 5 placard that was not valid as expired;
- 6 (B) the defendant remedies the defect by renewing
- 7 the expired disabled parking placard within 20 working days from
- 8 the date of the offense or before the defendant's first court
- 9 appearance date, whichever is later; and
- 10 (C) the disabled parking placard has not been
- 11 expired for more than 60 days; and
- 12 (2) assess an administrative fee of [not to exceed]
- 13 \$20 when the charge has been remedied.
- 14 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(1)(C), the court may
- 15 dismiss a charge of unlawfully parking a vehicle in a space
- 16 designated specifically for persons with disabilities, if at the
- 17 time of the offense the defendant's vehicle displays a disabled
- 18 parking placard that has been expired for more than 60 days. The
- 19 court shall assess an administrative fee of \$20 when a charge is
- 20 dismissed under this subsection.
- 21 SECTION 12. Section 31.127(f), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (f) A court may dismiss a charge of operating a vessel with
- 24 an expired certificate of number under Section 31.021 if:
- 25 (1) the defendant remedies the defect not later than
- 26 the 10th working day after the date of the offense and pays an
- 27 administrative fee of \$20 [not to exceed \$10]; and

- 1 (2) the certificate of number has not been expired for
- 2 more than 60 days.
- 3 SECTION 13. Section 103.0213, Government Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 103.0213. ADDITIONAL FEES AND COSTS IN CRIMINAL OR
- 6 CIVIL CASES: TRANSPORTATION CODE. An accused or defendant, or a
- 7 party to a civil suit, as applicable, shall pay the following fees
- 8 and costs under the Transportation Code if ordered by the court or
- 9 otherwise required:
- 10 (1) administrative fee on dismissal of charge of
- 11 driving with an expired motor vehicle registration (Sec. 502.407,
- 12 Transportation Code) . . . [not to exceed] \$20;
- 13 (2) administrative fee on dismissal of charge of
- 14 driving with an expired driver's license (Sec. 521.026,
- 15 Transportation Code) . . . [not to exceed] \$20;
- 16 (3) administrative fee on remediation of charge of
- 17 driving with an expired inspection certificate (Sec. 548.605,
- 18 Transportation Code) . . . [not to exceed] \$20;
- 19 (4) administrative fee for failure to appear for a
- 20 complaint or citation on certain offenses (Sec. 706.006,
- 21 Transportation Code) . . . \$30 for each violation; and
- 22 (5) administrative fee for failure to pay or satisfy
- 23 certain judgments (Sec. 706.006, Transportation Code) . . . \$30.
- 24 SECTION 14. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 25 to an administrative fee assessed for an offense committed on or
- 26 after the effective date of this Act. A fee assessed for an offense
- 27 committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the

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- 1 law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former
- 2 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
- 3 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
- 4 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 5 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
