## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the notification of a potential predator for civil
- 3 commitment
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 841, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 841.021. NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PREDATOR.
- 8 (a) Before the person's anticipated release date, the Texas
- 9 Department of Criminal Justice shall give to the multidisciplinary
- 10 team established under Section 841.022 written notice of the
- 11 anticipated release of a person who:
- 12 (1) is serving a sentence for:
- 13 (A) a sexually violent offense described by
- 14 Section 841.002(8)(A), (B), or (C); or
- 15 (B) what is, or as described by this chapter what
- 16 the department reasonably believes may be determined to be, a
- 17 sexually violent offense described by Section 841.002(8)(D); and
- 18 (2) may be a repeat sexually violent offender.
- 19 (b) Before the person's anticipated discharge date, the
- 20 Department of State Health Services shall give to the
- 21 multidisciplinary team established under Section 841.022 written
- 22 notice of the anticipated discharge of a person who:
- 23 (1) is committed to the department after having been
- 24 adjudged not guilty by reason of insanity of:

- 1 (A) a sexually violent offense described by
- 2 Section 841.002(8)(A), (B), or (C); or
- 3 (B) what is, or as described by this chapter what
- 4 the department reasonably believes may be determined to be, a
- 5 sexually violent offense described by Section 841.002(8)(D); and
- 6 (2) may be a repeat sexually violent offender.
- 7 (c) The Texas Department of Criminal Justice or the
- 8 Department of State Health Services, as appropriate, shall give the
- 9 notice described by Subsection (a) or (b) not later than the first
- 10 day of the 16th month before the person's anticipated [release or]
- 11 <u>date of</u> discharge[<del>date</del>] <u>from control of the Texas Department of</u>
- 12 Criminal Justice or the Department of State Health Services, but
- 13 under exigent circumstances may give the notice at any time before
- 14 the anticipated [release or] date of discharge [date]. The notice
- 15 must contain the following information:
- 16 (1) the person's name, identifying factors,
- 17 anticipated residence after release or discharge, and criminal
- 18 history;
- 19 (2) documentation of the person's institutional
- 20 adjustment and actual treatment; and
- 21 (3) an assessment of the likelihood that the person
- 22 will commit a sexually violent offense after release or discharge.
- 23 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 24 conduct that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 25 Conduct that occurs before the effective date of this Act is covered
- 26 by the law in effect at the time the conduct occurred, and the
- 27 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For the

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- 1 purposes of this section, conduct occurs before the effective date
- 2 of this Act if any element of the conduct occurred before that date.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
