- 5 SECTION 1. The board of regents of The University of Texas

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 6 System may acquire by purchase, exchange, gift, or otherwise, for
- 7 campus expansion and other university purposes of The University of
- 8 Texas at Arlington, all or part of the parcel of land described as:
- 9 One tract of land in the city of Arlington, Tarrant County,
- 10 Texas, more specifically described as follows:
- 11 BEGINNING at the corner of UTA Boulevard and South Center
- 12 Street;

- 13 THENCE South along South Center Street to the intersection of
- 14 South Center Street and East Mitchell Street;
- 15 THENCE East along East Mitchell Street to the intersection of
- 16 East Mitchell Street and South Mesquite Street;
- 17 THENCE North along South Mesquite Street to the intersection
- 18 of South Mesquite Street and UTA Boulevard;
- 19 THENCE West along E.Border Street to the beginning
- 20 intersection at the corner of E.Border Street and South Center
- 21 Street.
- 22 SECTION 2. The title to the land shall be taken in the name
- 23 of the board of regents of The University of Texas System and shall
- 24 be subject to the control and management of the board in the manner

- 1 and to the extent that the lands now owned by The University of
- 2 Texas System in fee simple are held and controlled.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act does not grant the state or The
- 4 University of Texas System the power of eminent domain over the
- 5 tract of land.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
