## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the use of e-mail and website technology by the Texas
- 3 Department of Licensing and Regulation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.207, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.207. USE OF TECHNOLOGY. (a) The commission shall
- 8 develop and implement a policy requiring the executive director and
- 9 department employees to research and propose appropriate
- 10 technological solutions to improve the department's ability to
- 11 perform its functions. The technological solutions must:
- 12 (1) ensure that the public is able to easily find
- 13 information about the department on the Internet;
- 14 (2) ensure that persons who want to use the
- 15 department's services are able to:
- 16 (A) interact with the department through the
- 17 Internet; and
- 18 (B) access any service that can be provided
- 19 effectively through the Internet; and
- 20 (3) be cost-effective and developed through the
- 21 department's planning processes.
- (b) The department shall provide on its Internet website a
- 23 <u>link to an Internet website that allows the public to track</u>
- 24 legislation affecting the programs administered by the department,

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- 1 which may be a website that provides legislative information
- 2 <u>administered by the Texas Legislature.</u>
- 3 (c) The department may satisfy any requirement under this
- 4 chapter or another law governing a program subject to regulation by
- 5 the department to provide notice by delivering the notice by e-mail
- 6 to the recipient's last known e-mail address if the recipient has
- 7 previously authorized the department to deliver the notice by
- 8 e-mail. An e-mail address used under this subsection is
- 9 confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,
- 10 Government Code.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
