4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Jeremy DeMarcus
6	Price Act.
7	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 11, Alcoholic Beverage
8	Code, is amended by adding Section 11.043 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 11.043. DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED PENALTIES SIGN.
10	(a) The commission by rule shall require the holder of a permit
11	authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises
12	consumption who does not hold a food and beverage certificate for
13	the premises to prominently display a sign inside each restroom on
14	the permit holder's premises that informs the public of:
15	(1) the criminal penalties for a conviction of the
16	offense of driving while intoxicated; and
17	(2) the average costs a person convicted of driving
18	while intoxicated can expect to pay, including attorney's fees,
19	criminal fines, court costs, bail, driver's license surcharges, and
20	alcohol education course fees.
21	(b) The commission's rules shall specify the size and
22	graphic design, including font size and type, and the language of
23	the sign. The rules may require the permit holder to display the
24	sign in a language other than English if the commission determines

1 that a substantial portion of the expected customers of the 2 establishment speak a language other than English.

3 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 61, Alcoholic Beverage
4 Code, is amended by adding Section 61.112 to read as follows:

5 <u>Sec. 61.112. DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED PENALTIES SIGN.</u> 6 (a) The commission by rule shall require the holder of a license 7 <u>authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises</u> 8 <u>consumption who does not hold a food and beverage certificate for</u> 9 <u>the premises to prominently display a sign inside each restroom on</u> 10 <u>the license holder's premises that informs the public of:</u>

11 (1) the criminal penalties for a conviction of the 12 offense of driving while intoxicated; and

13 (2) the average costs a person convicted of driving 14 while intoxicated can expect to pay, including attorney's fees, 15 criminal fines, court costs, bail, driver's license surcharges, and 16 alcohol education course fees.

17 (b) The commission's rules shall specify the size and 18 graphic design, including font size and type, and the language of 19 the sign. The rules may require the license holder to display the 20 sign in a language other than English if the commission determines 21 that a substantial portion of the expected customers of the 22 establishment speak a language other than English.
