4	SECTION 1. Section 61.036, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
6	(d) Regardless of the application, documentation, and
7	verification procedures or eligibility standards established by
8	the department under Subchapter A, a county may credit an
9	intergovernmental transfer to the state toward eligibility for
10	state assistance if the transfer was made to provide health care
11	services as part of the Texas Healthcare Transformation and Quality
12	Improvement Program waiver issued under 42 U.S.C. Section 1315.
13	(e) A county may credit toward eligibility for state
14	assistance intergovernmental transfers made under Subsection (d)
15	that in the aggregate do not exceed four percent of the county's
16	general revenue levy in any state fiscal year, provided:
17	(1) The commissioners court determines that the
18	expenditure fulfills the county's obligations to provide indigent
19	health care under this chapter;
20	(2) The commissioners court determines that the amount
21	of care available through participation in the waiver is sufficient
22	in type and amount to meet the requirements of this chapter; and
23	(3) The county receives periodic reports from health

care providers that receive supplemental or incentive payments

- 5 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2014, the Department
- 6 of State Health Services shall submit a report to the governor, the

- 9 services rendered to eligible residents under Chapter 61, Health
- 10 and Safety Code.
- 11 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 12 61.036, Health and Safety Code, applies only to state assistance
- 13 for health care services under Chapter 61, Health and Safety Code,
- 14 as amended by this Act, that are delivered on or after the effective
- 15 date of this Act.
- 16 (b) State assistance for health care services under Chapter
- 17 61, Health and Safety Code, that are delivered before the effective
- 18 date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately
- 19 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in
- 20 effect for that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
