1-22 Code, is amended to read as follows: 1-23 (a) The physician assistant board consists of <u>13</u> [nine] 1-24 members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the 1-25 senate as follows:

1-26 (1) seven [three] practicing physician assistant 1-27 members who each have at least five years of clinical experience as 1-28 a physician assistant;

1-29 (2) three physician members who are licensed in this 1-30 state and who supervise physician assistants; and

1-33 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 204.054, Occupations 1-34 Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-35 (a) Members of the physician assistant board are appointed 1-36 for staggered six-year terms. The terms of <u>four or five</u> [three] 1-37 members, as applicable, expire on February 1 of each odd-numbered 1-38 year.

1-39 SECTION 3. Section 204.055, Occupations Code, is amended to 1-40 read as follows:

1-41 Sec. 204.055. OFFICERS. The governor shall designate a 1-42 physician assistant member of the physician assistant board as the 1-43 presiding officer of the board to serve in that capacity at the will 1-44 of the governor. The physician assistant board shall select from 1-45 its membership a secretary to serve a one-year term.
