## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the offenses of interference with public duties,
3	required obedience to the order or direction of a police officer,
4	and assault, certain unsuccessful prosecutions therefor, and
5	related civil liability of a governmental unit.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Title 5, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
8	amended by adding Chapter 112 to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 112. LIABILITY OF GOVERNMENTAL UNIT FOR CERTAIN
10	UNSUCCESSFUL PROSECUTIONS
11	Sec. 112.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "governmental
12	unit" has the meaning assigned by Section 101.001.
13	Sec. 112.002. LIABILITY FOR CERTAIN RETALIATORY
14	PROSECUTIONS. (a) A person who is prosecuted for an offense under
15	Section 22.01(a)(1), Penal Code, Section 38.15(a)(1), Penal Code,
16	or Section 542.501(a)(1), Transportation Code, and is acquitted of
17	the offense may recover in a civil action against the governmental
18	unit that employed any peace officer who accused the person of the
19	offense of which the person was acquitted if the person shows by a
20	<pre>preponderance of the evidence that:</pre>
21	(1) the person was filming, recording, photographing,
22	documenting, or observing the peace officer; and
23	(2) the peace officer's accusation was made in
24	retaliation for the person's act of filming, recording,

- 1 photographing, or observing the peace officer.
- 2 <u>Sec. 112.003. REMEDIES. A person who prevails in a suit</u>
- 3 against a governmental unit described in Section 112.002 of this
- 4 chapter shall be entitled to recover only:
- 5 (1) the person's reasonable attorney's fees incurred
- 6 in connection with the prosecution; and
- 7 (2) three times the amount of any actual damages
- 8 incurred by the person arising from damage by a peace officer to any
- 9 recording equipment used in connection with the conduct which
- 10 resulted in the retaliatory prosecution.
- 11 Sec. 112.004. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY WAIVED. Sovereign
- 12 immunity to suit and liability is waived and abolished to the extent
- 13 of liability created by this chapter.
- SECTION 2. Section 38.15(c), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 (c) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a)(1)
- 17 that the conduct engaged in by the defendant:
- 18 (1) was intended to warn a person operating a motor
- 19 vehicle of the presence of a peace officer who was enforcing
- 20 Subtitle C, Title 7, Transportation Code; or
- 21 (2) consisted only of filming, recording,
- 22 photographing, documenting, or observing a peace officer.
- SECTION 3. Section 542.501, Transportation Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- Sec. 542.501. OBEDIENCE REQUIRED TO POLICE OFFICERS AND TO
- 26 SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS. (a) A person may not willfully fail or
- 27 refuse to comply with a lawful order or direction of:

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- 1 (1) a police officer; or
- 2 (2) a school crossing guard who:
- 3 (A) is performing crossing guard duties in a
- 4 school crosswalk to stop and yield to a pedestrian; or
- 5 (B) has been trained under Section 600.004 and is
- 6 directing traffic in a school crossing zone.
- 7 (b) Subsection (a)(1) does not apply to an order or
- 8 direction to cease filming, recording, photographing, documenting,
- 9 or observing a police officer while the officer is engaged in the
- 10 performance of official duties.
- 11 SECTION 4. Chapter 112, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 12 as added by this Act, applies only with respect to a prosecution of
- 13 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 5. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 15 this section, Section 38.15, Penal Code, and Section 542.501,
- 16 Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, apply to the
- 17 prosecution of an offense under one of those sections commenced
- 18 before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 19 (b) A final conviction for an offense under Section 38.15,
- 20 Penal Code, or Section 542.501, Transportation Code, that exists on
- 21 the effective date of this Act is unaffected by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
