- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 81.0531, Natural Resources Code, is 7
- amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to 8
- 9 read as follows:
- (b) The penalty may not exceed: 10
- 11 (1) $$25,000 \left[\frac{$10,000}{} \right]$ a day for each violation that is
- 12 not related to pipeline safety; or
- 13 (2) \$200,000 a day for each violation that is related
- to pipeline safety. 14
- (b-1) Each day a violation continues may be considered a 15
- 16 separate violation for purposes of penalty assessments.
- SECTION 2. Section 117.051, Natural Resources Code, is 17
- amended to read as follows: 18
- Sec. 117.051. CIVIL PENALTY. A person who violates this 19
- chapter or a rule adopted by the commission under this chapter is 20
- 21 subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 or [\$50 nor] more
- than \$200,000 [\$25,000] for each act of violation and for each day 22
- 23 of violation, provided that the maximum civil penalty that may be
- assessed for any related series of violations may not exceed \$2 24

- 1 million [\$500,000].
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 117.053(b), Natural Resources Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of
- 5 not more than \$2 million [\$25,000], confinement in the Texas
- 6 Department of Criminal Justice for a term of not more than five
- 7 years, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 117.054(b), Natural Resources Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of
- 11 not more than \$2\$ million [\$25,000], confinement in the Texas
- 12 Department of Criminal Justice for a term of not more than 15 years,
- 13 or both such fine and imprisonment.
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 121.204, Utilities Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- Sec. 121.204. CIVIL PENALTY. Each day of each violation of
- 17 a safety standard adopted under this subchapter is subject to a
- 18 civil penalty of not more than $$200,000 \ [\$25,000]$, except that the
- 19 maximum penalty that may be assessed for any related series of
- 20 violations may not exceed \$2 million [\$500,000]. The penalty is
- 21 payable to the state.
- SECTION 6. Section 121.206(b), Utilities Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (b) The penalty for each violation may not exceed \$200,000
- 25 [\$10,000]. Each day a violation continues may be considered a
- 26 separate violation for the purpose of penalty assessment.
- SECTION 7. Section 121.302, Utilities Code, is amended by

- 1 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (a) A gas utility is subject to a civil penalty if the gas
- 4 utility:
- 5 (1) violates this chapter;
- 6 (2) fails to perform a duty imposed by this chapter; or
- 7 (3) fails to comply with an order of the railroad
- 8 commission if the order is not stayed or suspended by a court order.
- 9 (a-1) A penalty under this section is payable to the state
- and shall be not less than $\frac{$1,000}{}$ [$\frac{$100}{}$] and not more than $\frac{$200,000}{}$
- 11 [\$1,000] for each violation or failure.
- 12 SECTION 8. Section 121.304(b), Utilities Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (b) The penalty for each violation or failure may not exceed
- 15 $\frac{$200,000}{}$ [$\frac{$10,000}{}$] a day. Each day a violation continues may be
- 16 considered a separate violation for purposes of penalty assessment.
- 17 SECTION 9. Section 121.310(b), Utilities Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (b) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of
- 20 not less than \$500 [\$50] and not more than \$2 million [\$1,000]. In
- 21 addition to the fine, the offense may be punishable by confinement
- 22 in jail for not less than 10 days nor more than six months.
- SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 24 to a violation committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 25 A violation committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 26 governed by the law in effect when the violation was committed, and
- 27 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For

- 1 purposes of this section, a violation was committed before the
- 2 effective date of this Act if any element of the violation was
- 3 committed before that date.
- 4 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
