S.B. No. 939

2 relating to reporting child abuse and neglect and to training

3 regarding recognizing and reporting child abuse and neglect at

- 4 schools, institutions of higher education, and other entities.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 38.004, Education Code,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The agency shall develop a policy governing the <u>reports</u>
- 9 of child abuse or neglect [reports] required by Chapter 261, Family
- 10 Code, of school districts, open-enrollment charter schools, and
- 11 their employees. The policy must provide for cooperation with law
- 12 enforcement child abuse investigations without the consent of the
- 13 child's parents if necessary, including investigations by the
- 14 Department of Family and Protective [and Regulatory] Services. The
- 15 policy must require each school district and open-enrollment
- 16 charter school employee to report child abuse or neglect in the
- 17 manner required by Chapter 261, Family Code. Each school district
- 18 and open-enrollment charter school shall adopt the policy.
- 19 SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 38.0041, Education Code,
- 20 is amended to read as follows:
- (c) The methods under Subsection (b)(1) for increasing
- 22 awareness of issues regarding sexual abuse and other maltreatment
- 23 of children must include training, as provided by this subsection,
- 24 concerning prevention techniques for and recognition of sexual

- 1 abuse and all other maltreatment of children. The training:
- 2 (1) must be provided, as part of a new employee
- 3 orientation, to <u>all</u> new school district and open-enrollment charter
- 4 school employees and to existing district and open-enrollment
- 5 charter school employees on a schedule adopted by the agency by rule
- 6 until all district and open-enrollment charter school employees
- 7 have taken the training [educators, including counselors and
- 8 coaches, and other district and charter school professional staff
- 9 members]; and
- 10 (2) [may be provided annually to any district or
- 11 charter school staff member; and
- 12 [(3)] must include training concerning:
- 13 (A) factors indicating a child is at risk for
- 14 sexual abuse or other maltreatment;
- 15 (B) likely warning signs indicating a child may
- 16 be a victim of sexual abuse or other maltreatment;
- 17 (C) internal procedures for seeking assistance
- 18 for a child who is at risk for sexual abuse or other maltreatment,
- 19 including referral to a school counselor, a social worker, or
- 20 another mental health professional;
- 21 (D) techniques for reducing a child's risk of
- 22 sexual abuse or other maltreatment; and
- (E) community organizations that have relevant
- 24 existing research-based programs that are able to provide training
- 25 or other education for school district or open-enrollment charter
- 26 school staff members, students, and parents.
- 27 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 38.0042 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 38.0042. POSTING CHILD ABUSE HOTLINE TELEPHONE NUMBER.
- 3 (a) Each public school and open-enrollment charter school shall
- 4 post in a clearly visible location in a public area of the school
- 5 that is readily accessible to students a sign in English and in
- 6 Spanish that contains the toll-free telephone number operated by
- 7 the Department of Family and Protective Services to receive reports
- 8 of child abuse or neglect.
- 9 (b) The commissioner may adopt rules relating to the size
- 10 and location of the sign required by Subsection (a).
- 11 SECTION 4. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 51.9761 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 51.9761. CHILD ABUSE REPORTING POLICY AND TRAINING.
- 14 (a) In this section, "other maltreatment" has the meaning assigned
- 15 by Section 42.002, Human Resources Code.
- 16 (b) Each institution of higher education shall adopt a
- 17 policy governing the reporting of child abuse and neglect as
- 18 required by Chapter 261, Family Code, for the institution and its
- 19 employees. The policy must require each employee of the
- 20 institution to report child abuse and neglect in the manner
- 21 required by Chapter 261, Family Code.
- (c) Each institution of higher education shall provide
- 23 training for employees who are professionals as defined by Section
- 24 261.101, Family Code, in prevention techniques for and the
- 25 recognition of symptoms of sexual abuse and other maltreatment of
- 26 children and the responsibility and procedure of reporting
- 27 suspected occurrences of sexual abuse and other maltreatment. The

- 1 training must include:
- 2 (1) techniques for reducing a child's risk of sexual
- 3 abuse or other maltreatment;
- 4 (2) factors indicating a child is at risk for sexual
- 5 abuse or other maltreatment;
- 6 (3) the warning signs and symptoms associated with
- 7 sexual abuse or other maltreatment and recognition of those signs
- 8 and symptoms; and
- 9 <u>(4) the requirements and procedures for reporting</u>
- 10 suspected sexual abuse or other maltreatment as provided by Chapter
- 11 261, Family Code.
- 12 SECTION 5. Section 42.0426, Human Resources Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 14 (a-1) A licensed facility shall require each employee of the
- 15 facility who attends a training program required by Subsection
- 16 (a)(1) to sign a statement verifying the employee's attendance at
- 17 the training program. The licensed facility shall maintain the
- 18 statement in the employee's personnel records.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
