## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to electric utility bill payment assistance programs for
- 3 certain veterans burned in combat.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 36.061, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) An electric utility located in a portion of this state
- 8 not subject to retail competition may establish a bill payment
- 9 <u>assistance program for a customer who is a military veteran who a</u>
- 10 medical doctor certifies has a significantly decreased ability to
- 11 regulate the individual's body temperature because of severe burns
- 12 received in combat. A regulatory authority shall allow as a cost or
- 13 expense a cost or expense of the bill payment assistance program.
- 14 The electric utility is entitled to:
- 15 (1) fully recover all costs and expenses related to
- 16 the bill payment assistance program;
- 17 (2) defer each cost or expense related to the bill
- 18 payment assistance program not explicitly included in base rates;
- 19 and
- 20 (3) apply carrying charges at the utility's weighted
- 21 average cost of capital to the extent related to the bill payment
- 22 assistance program.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 39.359 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 39.359. BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR BURNED VETERANS.
- 2 (a) A retail electric provider may establish a bill payment
- 3 assistance program for a customer who is a military veteran who a
- 4 medical doctor certifies has a significantly decreased ability to
- 5 regulate the individual's body temperature because of severe burns
- 6 received in combat.
- 7 (b) The commission shall compile a list of programs
- 8 <u>described by Subsection (a) that are available from retail electric</u>
- 9 providers. The commission shall publish the list on the
- 10 commission's Internet website and the office shall provide on the
- 11 office's Internet website a link to the list.
- 12 <u>(c)</u> A retail electric provider shall provide to the
- 13 commission information necessary to compile the list in the form,
- 14 manner, and frequency the commission by rule requires.
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 182, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
- 17 SUBCHAPTER D. BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR BURNED VETERANS
- Sec. 182.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "electric
- 19 cooperative" and "municipally owned utility" have the meanings
- 20 assigned by Section 11.003.
- Sec. 182.202. BURNED VETERANS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. (a) The
- 22 board of directors of an electric cooperative or the governing body
- 23 of a municipally owned utility may establish a bill payment
- 24 assistance program for a customer who is a military veteran who a
- 25 medical doctor certifies has a significantly decreased ability to
- 26 regulate the individual's body temperature because of severe burns
- 27 received in combat.

- 1 (b) The costs of a bill payment assistance program
- 2 established under Subsection (a) are considered a necessary
- 3 operations expense.
- 4 (c) The board of directors of an electric cooperative or the
- 5 governing body of a municipally owned utility may determine the
- 6 method to fund a bill payment assistance program established under
- 7 Subsection (a).
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
