- 13 Sec. 236.002. FIREARMS; SPORT SHOOTING RANGE.
- 14 (a) Notwithstanding any other law, including Chapter 251,
- 15 Agriculture Code, a county may not adopt regulations relating to:
- 16 (1) the transfer, private ownership, keeping,
- 17 transportation, licensing, or registration of firearms,
- 18 ammunition, or firearm supplies; or
- 19 (2) the discharge of a firearm at a sport shooting
- 20 range.
- 21 (b) The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
- 22 the state to obtain a temporary or permanent injunction against a
- 23 county adopting a regulation, other than a regulation under Section
- 24 236.003, in violation of this section.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

5 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
