1-15 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to allowing the attorney general to obtain an injunction
 1-18 against a municipality or county that adopts prohibited regulations
 1-19 regarding firearms, ammunition, or firearm supplies.

1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 229.001, Local Government Code, is
 1-22 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

1-23 (f) The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
 1-24 the state to obtain a temporary or permanent injunction against a
 1-25 municipality adopting a regulation in violation of this section.

1-26 SECTION 2. Section 236.002, Local Government Code, is
 1-27 amended to read as follows:

1-28 Sec. 236.002. FIREARMS; SPORT SHOOTING RANGE.
 1-29 (a) Notwithstanding any other law, including Chapter 251,
 1-30 Agriculture Code, a county may not adopt regulations relating to:

1-31 (1) the transfer, private ownership, keeping,
 1-32 transportation, licensing, or registration of firearms,
 1-33 ammunition, or firearm supplies; or

1-34 (2) the discharge of a firearm at a sport shooting
 1-35 range.

1-36 (b) The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
 1-37 the state to obtain a temporary or permanent injunction against a
 1-38 county adopting a regulation, other than a regulation under Section
 1-39 236.003, in violation of this section.

1-40 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-41 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-42 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-43 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-44 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
