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AN ACT

2 relating to the creation of the Texas Nonprofit Council to assist 3 with faith-based and community-based initiatives.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 535.055, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 535.055. [TASK FORCE ON 7 TEXAS NONPROFIT COUNCIL IMPROVING RELATIONS WITH NONPROFITS]. 8 (a) The <u>Texas Nonprofit</u> <u>Council</u> [interagency coordinating group task force] is established 9 10 to help direct the interagency coordinating group in carrying out the group's duties under this section. The commission shall 11 12 provide administrative support to the council [task force].

(b) The executive commissioner, in consultation with the presiding officer of the interagency coordinating group, shall appoint as members of the <u>council two representatives</u> [task force one representative] from each of the following groups and entities: (1) [a] statewide nonprofit <u>organizations</u>

19 (2) local governments; faith-based groups; 20 (3) community-based groups; 21 (4) 22 (5) consultants to nonprofit corporations; and [experts in grant writing; and 23 (6) 24 $\left[\frac{(7)}{a}\right]$ statewide associations [association] of

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nonprofit organizations. 1 [In addition to the interagency 2 (C) The council coordinating group's other duties, the interagency coordinating 3 4 group], in coordination with the interagency coordinating group [task force], shall: 5 6 make recommendations [develop and implement a (1)7 plan] for improving contracting relationships between state agencies and faith- and community-based organizations; 8 9 (2) develop best practices for cooperating and collaborating with faith- and community-based organizations; 10 11 (3) identify and address duplication of services provided by the state and faith- and community-based organizations; 12 13 and (4) identify and address gaps in state services that 14 15 faith- and community-based organizations could fill. (c-1) The council shall elect a chair or chairs and 16 17 secretary from among its members and shall assist the executive 18 commissioner in identifying individuals to fill vacant council position<u>s that arise.</u> 19 20 (c-2) Council members serve three-year terms. The terms expire on October 1 of every third year. A council member shall 21 serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. 22 The council [task force] shall prepare a biennial report 23 (d) detailing the council's work, including [describing actions taken 24 25 or not taken by the interagency coordinating group under this section and include] in the report any recommendations relating to 26 27 legislation necessary to address an issue identified [by the group]

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1 under this section. The <u>council</u> [task force] shall present the 2 report to the House Committee on Human Services or its successor, 3 the House Committee on Public Health or its successor, and the 4 Senate Health and Human Services Committee or its successor not 5 later than <u>December 1 of each even-numbered year</u> [September 1, 6 2012].

7 (e) <u>Chapter 2110 does not apply to the Texas Nonprofit</u>8 Council.

9 (f) The Texas Nonprofit Council is subject to Chapter 325 10 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by 11 that chapter, the council is abolished and this section expires 12 September 1, 2019. [This section expires September 1, 2013.]

13 SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2013, and by October 1 14 every three years thereafter, the executive commissioner of the 15 Health and Human Services Commission shall appoint members to the 16 Texas Nonprofit Council in accordance with Section 535.055, 17 Government Code, as amended by this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect August 31, 2013.
