A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Texas Nonprofit Council to assist with faith- and community-based initiatives. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 535.055, Government Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 TEXAS NONPROFIT COUNCIL 7 Sec. 535.055. [TASK FORCE ON IMPROVING RELATIONS WITH NONPROFITS]. (a) The <u>Texas Nonprofit</u> 8 Council [interagency coordinating group task force] is established 9 to help direct the interagency coordinating group in carrying out 10 11 the group's duties under this section. The commission shall 12 provide administrative support to the <u>council</u> [task force]. 13 (b) The executive commissioner, in consultation with the 14 presiding officer of the interagency coordinating group, shall appoint as members of the council two representatives [task force 15 one representative] from each of the following groups and entities: 16 (1) [a] statewide nonprofit 17 organizations [organization]; 18 local governments; 19 (2) faith-based groups; 20 (3) 21 (4) community-based groups; (5) 22 consultants to nonprofit corporations; and 23 (6) [experts in grant writing; and 24 $\left[\frac{(7)}{a}\right]$ statewide associations [association] of

1 nonprofit organizations.

2 (c) <u>The council</u> [In addition to the interagency 3 coordinating group's other duties, the interagency coordinating 4 group], in coordination with the <u>interagency coordinating group</u> 5 [task force], shall:

6 (1) <u>make recommendations</u> [develop and implement a 7 plan] for improving contracting relationships between state 8 agencies and faith- and community-based organizations;

9 (2) develop best practices for cooperating and 10 collaborating with faith- and community-based organizations;

(3) identify and address duplication of services provided by the state and faith- and community-based organizations; and

14 (4) identify and address gaps in state services that15 faith- and community-based organizations could fill.

16 <u>(c-1) The council shall elect a chair or chairs and</u> 17 <u>secretary from among its members and shall assist the executive</u> 18 <u>commissioner in identifying individuals to fill vacant council</u> 19 <u>positions that arise.</u>

20 (c-2) Council members serve three-year terms. The terms
21 expire on October 1 of every third year. A council member shall
22 serve a maximum of two consecutive terms.

(d) The <u>council</u> [task force] shall prepare a <u>biennial</u> report
<u>detailing the council's work, including</u> [describing actions taken
or not taken by the interagency coordinating group under this
section and include] in the report any recommendations relating to
legislation necessary to address an issue identified [by the group]

1 under this section. The <u>council</u> [task force] shall present the 2 report to the House Committee on Human Services or its successor, 3 the House Committee on Public Health or its successor, and the 4 Senate Health and Human Services Committee or its successor not 5 later than <u>December 1 of each even-numbered year</u> [September 1, 6 <u>2012</u>].

7 (e) <u>Chapter 2110 does not apply to the Texas Nonprofit</u>
8 <u>Council.</u> [This section expires September 1, 2013.]

9 SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2013, and by October 1 10 every three years thereafter, the executive commissioner of the 11 Health and Human Services Commission shall appoint members to the 12 Texas Nonprofit Council in accordance with Section 535.055, 13 Government Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect August 31, 2013.
