- The board shall specify conditions under which a 11
- 12 pharmacist may administer [medication, including] an immunization
- or [and] vaccination. The conditions must ensure that: 13
- 14 (1) [a licensed health care provider authorized

- [(2) failure to administer the medication, other than 17

- 7  $\underline{(4)}$  [ $\underline{(6)}$ ] the pharmacist administers an immunization

- 10  $\underline{(5)}$  [ $\overline{(7)}$ ] the authority of a pharmacist to administer
- 11 <u>an immunization or vaccination</u> [medication] may not be delegated.
- 12 SECTION 3. Sections 554.052(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 13 are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The board by rule shall require a pharmacist to notify a
- 15 physician who prescribes an immunization or vaccination [within 24
- 16 hours] after the pharmacist administers the immunization or
- 17 vaccination. The physician shall prescribe the period for providing
- 18 notice and the form of the notice under a written protocol. The
- 19 period for providing notice may not be later than the 14th day after
- 20 the date the immunization or vaccination is administered.
- 21 (c) Supervision by a physician is adequate if the delegating
- 22 physician:
- 23 (1) is responsible for formulating or approving an
- 24 order or protocol, including the physician's order, standing
- 25 medical order, or standing delegation order, and periodically
- 26 reviews the order or protocol and the services provided to a patient
- 27 under the order or protocol;

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- 1 (2) [except as provided by Subsection (c-1), has
- 2 established a physician-patient relationship with each patient
- 3 under  $\underline{\text{seven}}$  [ $\frac{14}{1}$ ] years of age and referred the patient to the
- 4 pharmacist;
- 5 (3) is geographically located to be easily accessible
- 6 to the pharmacy where an immunization or vaccination is
- 7 administered;
- 8 (4) receives, as appropriate, a periodic status report
- 9 on the patient, including any problem or complication encountered;
- 10 and
- 11 (5) is available through direct telecommunication for
- 12 consultation, assistance, and direction.
- SECTION 4. Section 554.052(c-1), Occupations Code, is
- 14 repealed.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
