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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the agreements, costs, revenues, and finances of 3 regional tollway authorities; authorizing taxes, fees, and 4 assessments.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subsection (d), Section 222.108, Transportation 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:

8 (d) In this section, "transportation project" has the 9 meaning assigned by Section 370.003 <u>and includes a turnpike project</u> 10 <u>and a system under Section 366.003</u>.

SECTION 2. Subsection (e), Section 222.110, Transportation
Code, is amended to read as follows:

13 (e) The sales and use taxes to be deposited into the tax 14 increment account under this section may be disbursed from the 15 account only to:

(1) pay for <u>the transportation project for which the</u> transportation reinvestment zone was designated, and for aesthetic improvements within the zone [projects authorized under Section 222.104], including the repayment of amounts owed under <u>a contract</u> [an agreement] entered into under <u>Section 222.106 or 222.107, as</u> applicable [that section]; and

(2) notwithstanding Sections 321.506 and 323.505, Tax
Code, satisfy claims of holders of tax increment bonds, notes, or
other obligations issued or incurred for <u>a transportation project</u>

1 for which the zone was designated [projects authorized under 2 Section 222.104].

3 SECTION 3. Subdivisions (8), (9), and (11), Section 4 366.003, Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

5 (8) "Governmental [Local governmental] entity" means a political subdivision of the state, including a municipality or a 6 7 county, a political subdivision of a county, a group of adjoining counties, a district organized or operating under Section 52, 8 9 Article III, or Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, the department, another state agency, [or] a nonprofit corporation, 10 11 including a transportation corporation created under Chapter 431, or any other public entity or instrumentality. 12

13 (9) "Revenue" means the tolls, rents, and other money
14 received by an authority:

15(A)from the ownership or operation of a turnpike16project; or17(B)under an agreement under Section 366.302 or

18 <u>366.303</u>.

(11) "Turnpike project" means a highway of any number
of lanes, with or without grade separations, owned or operated
<u>wholly or partly</u> by an authority under this chapter and any
improvement, extension, or expansion to that highway, including:

(A) an improvement to relieve traffic congestionand promote safety;

(B) a bridge, tunnel, overpass, underpass,
 interchange, service road, ramp, entrance plaza, approach, or
 tollhouse;

1 (C) an administration, storage, or other 2 building the authority considers necessary to operate the turnpike 3 project;

4 (D) a parking area or structure, rest stop, park,
5 and other improvement or amenity the authority considers necessary,
6 useful, or beneficial for the operation of a turnpike project;
7 [and]

8 (E) property rights, easements, and interests 9 the authority acquires to construct or operate the turnpike 10 project<u>; and</u>

11 (F) improvements in a transportation 12 reinvestment zone designated under Subchapter E, Chapter 222.

13 SECTION 4. Section 366.004, Transportation Code, is amended 14 to read as follows:

Sec. 366.004. [CONSTRUCTION] COSTS OF TURNPIKE DEFINED.
(a) The cost of [acquisition, construction, improvement,
extension, or expansion of] a turnpike project or system under this
chapter includes the cost of:

19 (1) the actual acquisition, construction, 20 improvement, extension, or expansion of the turnpike project or 21 system;

(2) the acquisition of real property, rights-of-way,
 property rights, easements, and other interests in real property;

24 (3) machinery and equipment;

(4) interest payable before, during, and after acquisition, construction, improvement, extension, or expansion as provided in the bond proceedings;

1 (5) traffic estimates, revenue estimates, engineering 2 and legal services, plans, specifications, surveys, appraisals, 3 construction cost estimates, and other expenses necessary or 4 incidental to determining the feasibility of the <u>acquisition</u>, 5 construction, improvement, extension, or expansion;

6 (6) necessary or incidental administrative, legal,7 and other expenses;

8 (7) compliance with laws, regulations, and 9 administrative rulings, including any costs associated with 10 <u>necessary environmental mitigation measures;</u>

11

(8) financing;

12 (9) the assumption of debts, obligations, and 13 liabilities of an entity relating to a turnpike project or system 14 transferred to an authority by that entity; [and]

15 (10) expenses related to the initial operation of the 16 turnpike project or system;

17 <u>(11) payment obligations of an authority under a</u> 18 <u>contract or agreement authorized by this chapter in connection with</u> 19 <u>the acquisition, construction, improvement, extension, expansion,</u> 20 <u>or financing of the turnpike project or system; and</u>

21 (12) any other cost and expense for the maintenance, 22 repair, administration, or operation of a turnpike project or 23 system, including all cost and expense for provision of tolling 24 services or financial security under Section 366.038.

(b) Costs <u>of</u> [attributable to] a turnpike project or system [and] incurred before the issuance of bonds to finance the turnpike project or system may be reimbursed from the proceeds of sale of the

1 bonds.

2 SECTION 5. Subsections (a), (g), and (k), Section 366.033,
3 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

4 (a) An authority, acting through its board, without state5 approval, supervision, or regulation, may:

6 (1) adopt rules for the regulation of its affairs and7 the conduct of its business;

8

(2) adopt an official seal;

9 (3) study, evaluate, design, <u>finance</u>, acquire, 10 construct, maintain, repair, and operate turnpike projects, 11 individually or as one or more systems;

12 (4) acquire, hold, and dispose of property in the 13 exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties under this 14 chapter;

(5) enter into contracts or operating agreements with
similar authorities, other governmental entities, or agencies of
the United States, a state of the United States, the United Mexican
States, or a state of the United Mexican States;

(6) enter into contracts or agreements necessary or
incidental to its duties and powers under this chapter;

(7) cooperate and work directly with property owners and governmental <u>entities</u> [agencies] and officials to support an activity required to promote or develop a turnpike project or system;

(8) employ and set the compensation and benefits of
 administrators, consulting engineers, attorneys, accountants,
 construction and financial experts, superintendents, managers,

full-time and part-time employees, agents, consultants, and such
 other persons as the authority considers necessary or useful;

(9) apply for and directly or indirectly receive and 3 spend loans, gifts, grants, and other contributions for the 4 construction of a turnpike project or system, and receive and spend 5 contributions of money, property, labor, or other things of value 6 7 from any source, including the United States, a state of the United States, the United Mexican States, a state of the United Mexican 8 9 States, the commission, the department, any subdivision of the state, or any other [local] governmental or private entity, to be 10 11 used for the purposes for which the grants or contributions are made, and enter into any agreement necessary for the grants or 12 contributions; 13

(10) install, construct, maintain, repair, renew, relocate, and remove public utility facilities in, on, along, over, or under a turnpike project;

17 (11) organize a corporation under Chapter 431 for the18 promotion and development of turnpike projects and systems;

19 (12) adopt and enforce rules not inconsistent with 20 this chapter for the use of any turnpike project or system, 21 including<u>:</u>

(A) rules relating to enforcement of tolls,
<u>fares, or other user fees;</u>
(B) speed and weight limit rules; and
(C) traffic and other public safety rules;
(13) enter into leases, operating agreements, service
agreements, licenses, franchises, and similar agreements with

1 public or private parties governing the parties' use of all or any 2 portion of a turnpike project and the rights and obligations of the 3 authority with respect to a turnpike project; and

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4 (14) do all things necessary or appropriate to carry5 out the powers expressly granted by this chapter.

6 (g) An authority and any [local] governmental entity, 7 <u>including the department</u>, may enter into a contract under which the 8 authority will operate a turnpike project or system on behalf of the 9 [local] governmental entity. [An authority may enter into a 10 contract with the department under which the authority will operate 11 a turnpike project or system on behalf of the department.]

12 If an authority enters into a contract or agreement to (k) 13 design, finance, construct, operate, maintain, or perform any other function for a turnpike project, system, or improvement authorized 14 15 by law on behalf of a [local] governmental entity, including the 16 commission, the department, a regional mobility authority, or any other entity, the contract or agreement may provide that the 17 authority, in performing the function, is governed by 18 the applicable provisions of this chapter and the rules and procedures 19 20 adopted by the authority under this chapter, in lieu of the laws, rules, or procedures applicable to the other party for the 21 performance of the same function. 22

SECTION 6. Section 366.034, Transportation Code, is amended
 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

25 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), the board may authorize
 26 the transfer of revenue from one or more turnpike projects or
 27 systems to a general fund of the authority if the transfer does not

violate, and is not inconsistent with, any bond proceedings 1 governing the use of the revenue. An authority may use revenue or 2 other money in a general fund for any purpose authorized by this 3 4 chapter. 5 SECTION 7. Section 366.036, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 366.036. TRANSFER OF TURNPIKE PROJECT OR SYSTEM. An authority may transfer any of its turnpike projects or 8 (a) 9 systems to one or more [local] governmental entities if: the authority has commitments from the governing 10 (1)11 bodies of the [local] governmental entities to assume jurisdiction over the transferred projects or systems; 12 13 (2) property and contract rights in the transferred projects or systems and bonds issued for the projects or systems are 14 15 not affected unfavorably; 16 (3) the transfer is not prohibited under the bond proceedings applicable to the transferred projects or systems; 17 adequate provision 18 (4) has been made for the assumption of all debts, obligations, and liabilities of 19 the authority relating to the transferred projects or systems by the 20 [local] governmental entities assuming jurisdiction over 21 the transferred projects or systems; 22 (5) the [local] governmental entities are authorized 23 24 to assume jurisdiction over the transferred projects or systems and 25 to assume the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the authority relating to the transferred projects or systems; and 26 27 (6) the transfer has been approved by the

1 commissioners court of each county that is part of the authority.

2 (b) An authority may transfer to one or more [local] governmental entities any traffic estimates, revenue estimates, 3 4 plans, specifications, surveys, appraisals, and other work product developed by the authority in determining the feasibility of the 5 acquisition, construction, improvement, extension, or expansion of 6 7 a turnpike project or system, and the authority's rights and obligations under any related agreements, if the requirements of 8 9 Subsections (a)(1) and (6) are met.

10 A [local] governmental entity shall, using any lawfully (c) 11 available funds, reimburse any expenditures made by an authority from its feasibility study fund or otherwise to pay the costs of 12 work product transferred to the [local] governmental entity under 13 Subsection (b) and any other amounts expended under related 14 15 agreements transferred to the [local] governmental entity. The 16 reimbursement may be made over time, as determined by the [local] governmental entity and the authority. 17

SECTION 8. Subsections (a), (c), and (f), Section 366.037, Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

20 (a) In addition to the powers granted under this chapter and without supervision or regulation by any state agency or other 21 22 [local] governmental entity, but subject to an agreement entered into under Subsection (c), the board of an authority may by 23 24 resolution, and on making the findings set forth in this 25 subsection, authorize the use of surplus revenue of a turnpike project or system for the study, design, construction, maintenance, 26 27 repair, and operation of a highway or similar facility that is not a

1 turnpike project if the highway or similar facility is:

2 (1) situated in a county in which the authority is
3 authorized to design, construct, and operate a turnpike project;

4 (2) anticipated to either:

5 (A) enhance the operation or revenue of an 6 existing, or the feasibility of a proposed, turnpike project by 7 bringing traffic to that turnpike project or enhancing the flow of 8 traffic either on that turnpike project or to or from that turnpike 9 project to another facility; or

10 (B) ameliorate the impact of an existing or 11 proposed turnpike project by enhancing the capability of another 12 facility to handle traffic traveling, or anticipated to travel, to 13 or from that turnpike project; and

14 (3) not anticipated to result in an overall reduction15 of revenue of any turnpike project or system.

(c) An authority shall enter into an agreement to implement this section with the department, the commission, <u>or another</u> [a <u>local</u>] governmental entity[, or another political subdivision] that owns a street, road, alley, or highway that is directly affected by the authority's turnpike project or related facility.

(f) Except as provided by this section, an authority has the same powers and may use the same procedures with respect to the study, financing, design, <u>acquisition</u>, construction, maintenance, repair, and operation of a highway or similar facility under this section as are available to the authority with respect to a turnpike project or system.

27 SECTION 9. Section 366.038, Transportation Code, is amended

by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as 1 2 follows:

(c) An authority may [not] provide financial security, 3 4 including a cash collateral account, <u>letter of credit</u>, <u>surety bond</u>, or other credit agreement, for the performance of tolling services 5 the authority provides under this section, regardless of when an 6 7 agreement to provide such services was entered into, unless [if]:

the authority determines that providing security 8 (1)9 could restrict the amount, or increase the cost, of bonds or other debt obligations the authority may subsequently issue under this 10 11 chapter; or

12 (2) the authority is not reimbursed its cost of 13 providing the security.

(c-1) Financial security provided and any related agreement 14 15 entered into by an authority under this section does not require the 16 approval of the attorney general under Section 366.116 or any other 17 law.

18 SECTION 10. Subsection (a), Section 366.071, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 19

20 (a) An authority may pay the expenses of studying the cost and feasibility of a proposed turnpike project or system, the 21 22 expenses of designing and engineering a proposed turnpike project or system, and any other expenses relating to the preparation and 23 24 issuance of bonds for a proposed turnpike project or system by:

25 (1)using legally available revenue derived from an existing turnpike project or system; 26

27 (2) borrowing money and issuing bonds or entering into

No. 1018 a loan agreement payable out of legally available revenue 1 anticipated to be derived from the operation of an existing 2 turnpike project or system; or 3 (3) pledging to the payment of the bonds or loan 4 5 agreements: 6 (A) legally available revenue anticipated to be 7 derived from the operation of an existing turnpike project or 8 system; 9 (B) proceeds from the sale of other bonds; or 10 (C) revenue legally available to the authority from another source. 11 SECTION 11. Subsection (c), 12 Section 366.072, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 13 (c) Money in the feasibility study fund may be used only to 14 15 pay: 16 (1) the expenses of: 17 (A) studying the cost and feasibility of a proposed turnpike project or system; or 18 19 (B) designing and engineering a proposed 20 turnpike project or system; or [and] any other expenses relating to: 21 (2) 22 (A) [(1)] the preparation and issuance of bonds for, or the financing of: 23 (i) the acquisition and construction of a 24 25 proposed turnpike project or system; or 26 (ii) [; [(2) the financing of] the improvement, extension, or 27

expansion of an existing turnpike project or system; or [and] 1 2 (B) [(3)] private participation, as authorized by law, in: 3 4 (i) the financing of a proposed turnpike 5 project or system; 6 (ii) $[\tau]$ the refinancing of an existing 7 turnpike project or system; $[_{\tau}]$ or 8 (iii) the financing of an improvement, 9 extension, or expansion of a turnpike project or system. 10 SECTION 12. The heading to Section 366.073, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 Sec. 366.073. FEASIBILITY STUDY BY MUNICIPALITY, COUNTY, 12 OTHER [LOCAL] GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, OR PRIVATE GROUP. 13 SECTION 13. Subsection 14 (a), Section 366.073, 15 Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 16 (a) One or more municipalities, counties, or [local] 17 governmental entities, a combination of municipalities, counties, and [local] governmental entities, or a private 18 group or combination of individuals [in this state] may pay all or part of 19 20 the expenses of studying the cost and feasibility of a proposed turnpike project or system and any other expenses relating to: 21 22 the preparation and issuance of bonds for, or the (1)financing of: 23 24 (A) acquisition and construction the of а 25 proposed turnpike project or system by an authority; or (B) [(2)] the improvement, 26 extension, or 27 expansion of an authority's existing turnpike project or system; or

(2) [(3)] the use of private participation under
 applicable law in connection with the acquisition, construction,
 improvement, expansion, extension, maintenance, repair, or
 operation of a turnpike project or system by an authority.

5 SECTION 14. Section 366.111, Transportation Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (i) to 7 read as follows:

8 (a) An authority, by adoption of a bond resolution, may 9 authorize the issuance of bonds to pay all or part of the cost of a 10 turnpike project or system, to refund any bonds previously issued 11 for the turnpike project or system, or to pay for all or part of the 12 cost of a turnpike project or system that <u>is or</u> will become a part of 13 another system.

14 (i) Bonds issued under this chapter shall be considered 15 authorized investments under Chapter 2256, Government Code, for 16 this state, any governmental entity, and any other public entity 17 proposing to invest in the bonds.

18 SECTION 15. Subsections (a) and (b), Section 366.113, 19 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The principal of, interest on, and any redemptionpremium on bonds issued by an authority are payable solely from:

(1) the revenue of the turnpike project or system for which the bonds are issued, including tolls pledged to pay the bonds;

(2) payments made under an agreement with the
commission or a [local] governmental entity as <u>authorized</u>
[provided] by <u>this chapter</u> [Subchapter G];

1 (3) <u>revenue</u> [money derived from any other source 2 available to the authority, other than money derived] from a 3 turnpike project that is not part of the same system or [money 4 derived] from a different system[, except to the extent] that [the 5 surplus revenue of a turnpike project or system] has been pledged 6 for that purpose <u>under Section 366.175; [and]</u>

7 (4) amounts received under a credit agreement relating
8 to the turnpike project or system for which the bonds are issued;

9 (5) revenue or other money in a general fund of an 10 <u>authority;</u>

11

(6) proceeds of the sale of other bonds; and

12 (7) revenue or other money derived from any other 13 source available to the authority.

Bonds issued under this chapter do not constitute a debt 14 (b) 15 of the state, a governmental entity, or any of the counties of an 16 authority or a pledge of the faith and credit of the state, a governmental entity, or any of the counties. Each bond must contain 17 on its face a statement to the effect that the state, the authority, 18 [and] the counties of the authority, and any other governmental 19 entity are not obligated to pay the bond or the interest on the bond 20 from a source other than the amount pledged to pay the bond and the 21 interest on the bond, and [neither] the faith and credit and taxing 22 power of neither the state, any governmental entity, or the 23 counties of the authority are pledged to the payment of the 24 25 principal of or interest on the bond. This subsection does not apply to a governmental entity that has issued bonds or entered into 26 27 an agreement under Subchapter G.

1SECTION 16.Subsection(a),Section366.114,2Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

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(a) A lien on or a pledge of revenue from a turnpike project
or system under this chapter, a lien on or a pledge of revenue from
[or on] a reserve, replacement, or other fund established in
connection with a bond issued under this chapter, or a lien on or a
pledge of revenue from a contract or agreement entered into under

8 this chapter:

9 (1) is enforceable at the time of payment for and 10 delivery of the bond <u>or on the effective date of the contract or</u> 11 <u>agreement;</u>

12 (2) applies to an item on hand or subsequently 13 received;

14 (3) applies without physical delivery of an item or15 other act; and

16 (4) is enforceable against any person having any 17 claim, in tort, contract, or other remedy, against the applicable 18 authority without regard to whether the person has notice of the 19 lien or pledge.

20 SECTION 17. Subsection (a), Section 366.117, 21 Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A bank or trust company incorporated under the laws of
this state or that maintains an office in this state that acts as
depository of the proceeds of bonds or of revenue may furnish
indemnifying bonds or pledge securities that an authority requires.
SECTION 18. Section 366.118, Transportation Code, is
amended to read as follows:

Sec. 366.118. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW; CONFLICTS. All laws affecting the issuance of bonds by [local] governmental entities, including Chapters 1201, 1202, 1204, and 1371, Government Code, apply to bonds issued under this chapter. To the extent of a conflict between those laws and this chapter, the provisions of this chapter prevail.

7 SECTION 19. Subsection (a), Section 366.162,
8 Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

9 (a) An authority may construct or improve a turnpike project 10 on real property, including a right-of-way acquired by the 11 authority or provided to the authority for that purpose by the 12 commission, a political subdivision of this state, or any other 13 [local] governmental entity.

SECTION 20. Subchapter E, Chapter 366, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 366.1631 to read as follows:

Sec. 366.1631. PARTICIPATION PAYMENT FOR REAL PROPERTY.
(a) As an alternative to paying for an interest in real property or a real property right with a single fixed payment, an authority may, with the property owner's consent, pay the owner by means of a participation payment.

21 (b) A right to receive a participation payment under this 22 section is subordinate to any right to receive a fee as payment on 23 the principal of or interest on a bond that is issued for the 24 construction of the applicable segment.

(c) In this section, "participation payment" means an
 intangible legal right to receive a percentage of one or more
 identified fees related to a segment constructed by the authority.

1SECTION 21.Subsection(b),Section366.168,2Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

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At its option, an authority may negotiate for and (b) 3 4 purchase the severed real property or any part of the severed real property if the authority and the property owner agree on terms for 5 Notwithstanding Section 272.001, Local Government 6 the purchase. 7 Code, an [An] authority may, by any commercially available method, sell and dispose of severed real property that it determines is not 8 9 necessary or useful to the authority. Severed property must be 10 appraised before being offered for sale by an authority.

SECTION 22. Subsections (a), (b), and (c), Section 366.169, Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) An authority may use real property, including submerged
land, streets, alleys, and easements, owned by the state or <u>another</u>
[a local] governmental entity that the authority considers
necessary for the construction or operation of a turnpike project.

17 (b) The state or <u>another</u> [a local] governmental entity 18 having charge of public real property may consent to the use of the 19 property for a turnpike project.

Except as provided by Section 228.201, the state or 20 (C) another [a local] governmental entity may convey, grant, or lease 21 to an authority real property, including highways and other real 22 property already devoted to public use and rights or easements in 23 24 real property, that may be necessary or convenient to accomplish 25 the authority's purposes, including the construction or operation of a turnpike project. A conveyance, grant, or lease under this 26 27 section may be made without advertising, court order, or other

action other than the normal action of the state or <u>another</u> [local]
 governmental entity necessary for a conveyance, grant, or lease.

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3SECTION 23.Subsection(c),Section366.170,4Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

5 An authority has full easements and rights-of-way (c) through, across, under, and over any property owned by the state or 6 7 another [any local] governmental entity that are necessary or convenient to construct, acquire, or efficiently operate a turnpike 8 9 project or system under this chapter. This subsection does not 10 affect the obligation of the authority under other state law, 11 including Section 373.102, to compensate or reimburse the state for the use or acquisition of an easement or right-of-way on property 12 owned by or on behalf of the state. An authority's use of property 13 owned by or on behalf of the state is subject to any covenants, 14 15 conditions, restrictions, or limitations affecting that property.

16 SECTION 24. Section 366.173, Transportation Code, is 17 amended by amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding 18 Subsection (h) to read as follows:

19 (b) Tolls must be set so that the aggregate of tolls from an 20 authority's turnpike project or system, together with other revenue 21 of the turnpike project or system:

22

(1) provides revenue sufficient to pay:

(A) the cost of maintaining, repairing, and
 operating the turnpike project or system; [and]

(B) the principal of and interest on the bonds
issued for the turnpike project or system as those bonds become due
and payable; and

S.B. No. 1018 1 (C) any other payment obligations of the authority under a contract or agreement authorized under this 2 3 chapter; and 4 (2) creates reserves for а purpose listed under Subdivision (1). 5 Tolls are not subject to supervision or regulation by 6 (c) 7 any state agency or other [local] governmental entity. Tolls and other revenue derived from a turnpike project 8 (d) 9 or system for which bonds are issued, except the part necessary to pay the cost of maintenance, repair, and operation and to provide 10 11 reserves for those costs as may be provided in the bond proceedings, shall be set aside at regular intervals as may be provided in the 12 13 bond resolution or trust agreement in a sinking fund that is pledged to and charged with the payment of: 14 15 (1)interest on the bonds as it becomes due; 16 (2) principal of the bonds as it becomes due; 17 necessary charges of paying agents for paying (3) principal and interest; [and] 18 (4) the redemption price or the purchase price of 19 20 bonds retired by call or purchase as provided by the bond 21 proceedings; and 22 (5) any amounts due under credit agreements. (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an 23 authority may pledge all or any part of its revenue and any other 24 25 funds available to the authority to the payment of any obligations of the authority under a contract or agreement authorized by this 26 27 chapter.

1 SECTION 25. Section 366.175, Transportation Code, is
2 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 366.175. USE OF [SURPLUS] REVENUE. The board of an 3 4 authority may by resolution authorize the use of [surplus] revenue of a turnpike project or system to pay the costs of another turnpike 5 project or system [other than a project financed under Subchapter 6 7 G]. The board may in the resolution prescribe terms for the use of the revenue, including the pledge of the revenue, but may not take 8 9 an action under this section that violates, impairs, or is inconsistent with a bond resolution, trust agreement, or indenture 10 11 governing the use of the [surplus] revenue.

26 (j) The board of an authority shall select one director as 27 the presiding officer of the board to serve in that capacity until

1 the <u>person is no longer</u> [person's term as] a director <u>or the board</u> 2 <u>selects another director as the presiding officer</u> [expires]. The 3 board shall elect one director as assistant presiding officer. The 4 board shall select a secretary and treasurer, neither of whom need 5 be a director.

5 An authority may enter into an agreement with one or (a) more [a] public or private entities [entity], including a toll road 6 7 corporation, the United States, a state of the United States, the United Mexican States, a state of the United Mexican States, or a 8 9 [local] governmental entity, [or another political subdivision,] to permit the entity, jointly with the authority, to study the 10 11 feasibility of a turnpike project or system or to acquire, design, finance, construct, maintain, repair, operate, extend, or expand a 12 13 turnpike project or system. (c) An authority may not incur a financial obligation on

(d) An authority or a county in an authority is not liable
for any financial or other obligation of a turnpike project <u>or</u>
<u>system</u> solely because a private entity <u>acquires</u>, constructs,

(b) In addition to the powers provided by Subsection (a), a
[local] governmental entity may, within any applicable
constitutional limitations, agree with an authority to:

5 (1) issue bonds or enter into and make payments under 6 an agreement to acquire, construct, maintain, or operate any 7 portion of a turnpike project or system of that authority;

(2) create:

(A) a taxing district;

10 (B) a transportation reinvestment zone under 11 Subchapter E, Chapter 222; or
