- 3 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 4 16.059(b), Business & Commerce Code, applies only to a renewal
- 5 application filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 6 renewal application filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that
- 8 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
