A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to parking privileges of disabled veterans on the property
3	of institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 681.008, Transportation Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:
7	(a-1) A vehicle described by Subsection (a) may be parked
8	for an unlimited period in a parking space or area that is
9	designated specifically for persons with physical disabilities on
10	the property of an institution of higher education, as defined by
11	Section 61.003, Education Code, regardless of whether a permit is
12	generally required for the use of the space or area. An institution
13	of higher education may require a vehicle described by Subsection
14	(a) to display a parking permit issued by the institution
15	specifically for the purpose of implementing this subsection, but
16	may not charge a fee for the permit. This subsection does not
17	entitle a person to park a vehicle described by Subsection (a) in a
18	parking space or area that has not been designated specifically for
19	persons with physical disabilities on the property of the
20	institution if the vehicle has not been granted or assigned a
21	parking permit required by the institution.
22	(a-2) Subsection (a-1) does not apply to a parking space or
23	area located in:
24	(1) a controlled access parking facility if at least

1	50 percent of the number of parking spaces or areas designated
2	specifically for persons with physical disabilities on the property
3	of the institution of higher education are located outside a
4	controlled access parking facility;
5	(2) an area temporarily designated for special event
6	parking; or
7	(3) an area where parking is temporarily prohibited
8	for health or safety concerns.
9	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
10	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
11	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
12	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
13	Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
