9	education service center shall establish a voluntary teacher

11	(b) A teacher who is selected as a teacher of the year from a
12	regional education service center region under a program in which
13	the agency participates is entitled to serve as a member of the
14	teacher advisory council.
15	(c) The teacher advisory council may be consulted by the
16	agency, members of the legislature, school districts, public school
17	teachers, and other parties as appropriate to provide advice on
18	issues that affect public education, including the development and
19	implementation of policies, procedures, and programs that affect
20	public education.
21	(d) Each regional education service center shall make
22	teleconferencing and other technological resources available to
23	the teacher advisory council to accomplish the purposes of this
24	section.

(e) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement and
administer this section.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
