1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a residential tenant's lease obligation after the loss
- 3 of the leased premises resulting from a natural disaster.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 92, Property Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 92.062 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 92.062. LEASE TERM AFTER NATURAL DISASTER. If a rental
- 8 premises is, as a practical matter, totally unusable for
- 9 residential purposes as a result of a natural disaster such as a
- 10 hurricane, tornado, flood, extended freeze, or widespread
- 11 windstorm, a landlord that allows a tenant to move to another rental
- 12 unit owned by the landlord may not require the tenant to execute a
- 13 <u>lease for a term longer than the term remaining on the tenant's</u>
- 14 lease on the date the premises was rendered unusable as a result of
- 15 the natural disaster.
- SECTION 2. Section 92.062, Property Code, as added by this
- 17 Act, applies only to a lease that is executed or renewed on or after
- 18 January 1, 2014. A lease that is executed or renewed before January
- 19 1, 2014, is governed by the law in effect at the time the lease was
- 20 executed or renewed, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 21 purpose.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2014.
