- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 37.0814 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 37.0814. USE OF OC SPRAY, STUN GUN, OR TASER AGAINST
- 9 STUDENTS PROHIBITED. (a) In this section:
- 10 (1) "OC spray" means any aerosol-propelled
- 11 debilitation device that is composed of a lachrymatory chemical
- 12 compound that irritates the eyes to cause tears, pain, or temporary
- 13 blindness. The term includes pepper spray, capsicum spray, OC gas,
- 14 and oleoresin capsicum.
- 15 (2) "Stun gun" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 16 38.14, Penal Code.

- 17 (3) "Taser" means a device manufactured, sold, or
- 18 <u>distributed</u> by Taser International, Incorporated, that is
- 19 intended, designed, made, or adapted to incapacitate a person by
- 20 inflicting an electrical charge through the emission of a
- 21 projectile or conductive stream. The term, for purposes of this
- 22 section, includes a similar device manufactured, sold, or
- 23 distributed by another person.
- 24 (b) The board of trustees of a school district shall

- 1 prohibit school district peace officers, security personnel, and
- 2 other employees from using OC spray or a stun gun or Taser to subdue
- 3 <u>a student on school property or while attending a school-sponsored</u>
- 4 or school-related activity off of school property.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
