- 2 relating to delinquent motor vehicle registrations and
- 3 inspections; authorizing a change in the amount of a fee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 502.045(d) and (e), Transportation
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) A person who has been arrested or received a citation
- 8 for a violation of Section 502.472 may register the vehicle being
- 9 operated at the time of the offense for a 12-month period without
- 10 change to the initial month of registration only if the person:
- 11 (1) meets the other requirements for registration
- 12 under this chapter; and
- 13 (2) <u>as applicable</u>, pays [an additional charge equal to
- 14 20 percent of] the appropriate [prescribed] fee established under
- 15 Section 502.360.
- 16 (e) The board by rule shall adopt a list of evidentiary
- 17 items sufficient to establish good reason for delinquent
- 18 registration under Subsection (b) and provide for the evidence that
- 19 may be used to establish good reason under that subsection. The
- 20 rules must require the evidence to include an affidavit stating the
- 21 <u>reason.</u>
- SECTION 2. Section 502.048, Transportation Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- Sec. 502.048. PROOF OF SAFETY INSPECTION REQUIRED; REFUSAL

- 1 TO REGISTER UNSAFE VEHICLE. (a) The department may not register a
- 2 vehicle unless the vehicle has complied with the safety inspection
- 3 requirements of Chapter 548.
- 4 (b) The department may refuse to register a motor vehicle
- 5 and may cancel, suspend, or revoke a registration if the department
- 6 determines that a motor vehicle is unsafe, improperly equipped, or
- 7 otherwise unfit to be operated on a public highway.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
- 9 is amended by adding Section 502.360 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 502.360. DELINQUENT REGISTRATION FEE. The board by
- 11 rule shall establish a delinquent registration fee schedule for
- 12 applicants for registration who are delinquent under Section
- 13 502.045 without good reason under that section and register a
- 14 vehicle later than the fifth day after the expiration date of the
- 15 vehicle's registration period. The fee schedule established under
- 16 this section must include an increase in the delinquent
- 17 registration fee on the first day of each month after the month
- 18 during which a registration becomes delinquent. The board may
- 19 determine the amount of the increase.
- SECTION 4. Section 548.101, Transportation Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 548.101. GENERAL ONE-YEAR INSPECTION PERIOD. Except
- 23 as provided by Section 548.102, the department shall require an
- 24 annual inspection. The department shall set the periods of
- 25 inspection and may make rules with respect to those periods. The
- 26 department shall adopt rules that require the new inspection period
- 27 of a vehicle that is inspected after the expiration date of the

- 1 vehicle's inspection period to end as if the vehicle was inspected
- 2 before the expiration date.
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 548.501, Transportation Code, is amended
- 4 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 5 (c) The department shall adopt rules that increase the fee
- 6 for inspection of a vehicle that is inspected later than the fifth
- 7 day after the expiration date of the vehicle's inspection period.
- 8 The rules adopted under this subsection must include an increase on
- 9 the first day of each month after the month in which the expiration
- 10 date occurred.
- 11 SECTION 6. Section 548.505, Transportation Code, is amended
- 12 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 13 <u>(c) The department shall adopt rules that increase the fee</u>
- 14 for inspection of a vehicle that is inspected under Section
- 15 548.301(a) later than the fifth day after the expiration date of the
- 16 vehicle's inspection period. The rules adopted under this
- 17 subsection must include an increase on the first day of each month
- 18 after the month in which the expiration date occurred.
- 19 SECTION 7. Not later than December 1, 2013, the Texas
- 20 Department of Motor Vehicles shall adopt the rules required by:
- 21 (1) Section 502.045(e), Transportation Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act, and Section 502.360, Transportation Code, as
- 23 added by this Act; and
- 24 (2) Section 548.101, Transportation Code, as amended
- 25 by this Act, and Sections 548.501(c) and 548.505(c), Transportation
- 26 Code, as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect January 1, 2014.
