## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the use of real property by the University of 3 Houston--Sugar Land.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the transfer of real 6 property, on which the University of Houston--Sugar Land is now 7 located, to the University of Houston System by the Texas 8 Department of Transportation pursuant to Chapter 1243 (H.B. 1961), 9 Acts of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997, was made in the 10 public interest and continues to serve all public purposes of the 11 state listed in Section 1(a) of Chapter 1243.

SECTION 2. The legislature finds that:

(1) the public purpose requirements placed on the property transferred pursuant to Chapter 1243 are served if the property is used for higher education purposes that encompass more than strictly academic pursuits; and

17 (2) the language in Chapter 1243 that required the 18 property to be used "only for higher education purposes" is 19 misleading to the extent that it may be construed to imply that the 20 property is reserved for strictly academic pursuits.

SECTION 3. To clarify the intent of the legislature and in accordance with the findings made by this Act, the ownership and transfer documents for the property shall be amended to state that the University of Houston--Sugar Land shall use the property "for

S.B. No. 1165 1 higher education purposes" consistent with the purposes of the 2 university.

3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
