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- 2 relating to the powers and duties of the Texas Medical Board and the

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 154.053, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board shall notify by personal delivery or certified
- 8 mail a physician who is the subject of a complaint filed with the
- 9 board that a complaint has been filed and shall provide the
- 10 physician with a full copy, without redaction, of the complaint,
- 11 including a statement of the alleged violation in plain language.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 154.0561, Occupations Code, is amended
- 13 by adding Subsections (e) and (f) to read as follows:
- 14 (e) The board shall deliver a copy of the preliminary and
- 15 final reports, including any dissenting or minority report, to the
- 16 physician who is the subject of the review.
- 17 (f) The name and medical credentials of each physician who
- 18 files an expert report shall be provided to the physician who is
- 19 the subject of review.
- 20 Section 3. Texas Medical Board shall adopt the rules
- 21 required under Sections 156.059 and 301.304, Occupations Code, as
- 22 added by this Act.
- SECTION 4. Not later than November 1, 2013, the Texas
- 24 Medical Board shall adopt the rules required under Sections 154.053

- 1 and 154.0561, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2014, the Texas Medical
- 3 Board shall report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
- 4 the speaker of the house of representatives concerning the adoption
- 5 of rules as required by Sections 154.053 and 154.0561, Occupations
- 6 Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 6. Sections 154.053 and 154.0561, Occupations Code,
- 8 as added by this Act, apply only to the investigation of a complaint
- 9 or a disciplinary action based on a complaint filed on or after the
- 10 effective date of this Act. The investigation of a complaint or a
- 11 disciplinary action based on a complaint filed before that date is
- 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the complaint was filed,
- 13 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act relating to
- 15 the Texas Medical Board's complaint procedures apply only to a
- 16 complaint filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 17 complaint filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 18 the law in effect on the date the complaint is filed, and the former
- 19 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
