## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to a customer's right to privacy of smart meter collected 3 data.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 39.107(b), Utilities Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 Metering services provided to residential customers and (b) 8 to nonresidential customers other than those required by the independent system operator to have an interval data recorder meter 9 10 shall continue to be provided by the transmission and distribution utility affiliate of the electric utility that was serving the area 11 12 before the introduction of customer choice. Retail electric 13 providers serving residential and nonresidential customers other than those required by the independent system operator to have an 14 15 interval data recorder meter may request that the transmission and distribution utility provide specialized meters, meter features, 16 17 or add-on accessories so long as they are technically feasible and generally available in the market and provided that the retail 18 electric provider pays the differential cost of such a meter or 19 accessory. Metering and billing services provided to residential 20 21 customers shall be governed by the customer safeguards adopted by 22 the commission under Section 39.101. All meter data, including all data generated, provided, or otherwise made available, by advanced 23 24 meters and meter information networks, shall belong to a customer,

1 including data used to calculate charges for service, historical 2 load data, and any other proprietary customer information. A 3 customer may authorize its data to be provided to one or more retail 4 electric providers under rules and charges established by the 5 commission. <u>An entity other than a retail electric provider or</u> 6 <u>electric utility may only have access to meter data with written</u> 7 <u>consent from a customer under rules established by the commission.</u>

8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
