2	relating to improving access to nursing education programs.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 51.762(a), Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	(a) The board, with the assistance of an advisory committee
7	composed of representatives of general academic teaching
8	institutions, junior college districts, public state colleges, and
9	public technical institutes, and with the consultation of all
10	institutions of higher education that admit freshman-level
11	students:
12	(1) shall adopt by rule:

- 13 (A) a common admission application form for use 14 by a person seeking admission as a freshman student to a general academic teaching institution; [and] 15
- (B) an electronic common admission application 16 form for use by a person seeking admission as a freshman student to 17 an institution of higher education that admits freshman-level 18
- students, other than a general academic teaching institution; and 19
- 20 (C) a common admission application form for use
- 21 by a person seeking admission as a freshman student to a nursing
- 22 education program at an institution of higher education; and
- 23 (2) may adopt by rule a printed format common admission application form for use by a person seeking admission as 24

- 1 a freshman student to an institution of higher education that
- 2 admits freshman-level students, other than a general academic
- 3 teaching institution.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 61.026, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 61.026. COMMITTEES AND ADVISORY COMMITTEES. (a) The
- 7 chairman may appoint committees from the board's membership as the
- 8 chairman [he] or the board may find necessary from time to time.
- 9 The board may appoint advisory committees from outside its
- 10 membership as it may deem necessary.
- 11 (b) If the board directs an advisory committee to assist the
- 12 board in exercising its authority under Section 61.051(j) regarding
- 13 an off-campus course in nursing education, including clinical
- 14 coursework, the board shall require the advisory committee to
- 15 <u>include or consult with one or more for-profit career schools</u>
- 16 offering nursing education courses in the area where the course is
- 17 to be offered.
- SECTION 3. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 19 Subchapter II to read as follows:
- 20 SUBCHAPTER II. NURSING FACULTY LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
- Sec. 61.9821. REPAYMENT AUTHORIZED. The board shall
- 22 establish and administer a program to provide, in accordance with
- 23 this subchapter and board rules, assistance in the repayment of
- 24 student loans for nurses who:
- 25 (1) are serving on the faculties of nursing degree
- 26 programs at institutions of higher education or private or
- 27 independent institutions of higher education in positions that

- 1 require an advanced degree in professional nursing; and
- 2 (2) apply and qualify for the assistance.
- 3 Sec. 61.9822. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive loan
- 4 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a nurse must:
- (1) apply to the board;
- 6 (2) at the time of application for repayment
- 7 <u>assistance have been employed full-time for at least one year as,</u>
- 8 and be currently employed full-time as, a faculty member of a
- 9 nursing degree program at an institution of higher education or a
- 10 private or independent institution of higher education; and
- 11 (3) comply with any additional requirements adopted by
- 12 board rule.
- Sec. 61.9823. LIMITATIONS. (a) On qualifying for loan
- 14 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a nurse may receive
- 15 repayment assistance for each year of full-time employment as a
- 16 faculty member of a nursing degree program at an institution of
- 17 higher education or private or independent institution of higher
- 18 education, not to exceed five years.
- 19 (b) The amount of loan repayment assistance received by a
- 20 nurse under this subchapter may not exceed \$5,000 in any one year.
- 21 (c) The total amount of loan repayment assistance provided
- 22 under this subchapter may not exceed the total amount of gifts and
- 23 grants accepted by the board for the repayment assistance,
- 24 legislative appropriations for the repayment assistance, and other
- 25 funds available to the board for the repayment assistance,
- 26 including any money reallocated under Section 61.9826.
- Sec. 61.9824. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide

- 1 repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan for
- 2 education at any public or private institution of higher education,
- 3 including a loan for undergraduate education, received by an
- 4 eligible person through any lender.
- 5 (b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a
- 6 $\underline{\text{student loan that is in default at the time of the nurse's}}$
- 7 <u>application</u>.
- 8 Sec. 61.9825. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
- 9 repayment under this subchapter in a lump sum:
- 10 (1) payable to both the lender or other holder of the
- 11 loan and the nurse; or
- 12 (2) directly to the lender or other holder of the loan
- 13 on the nurse's behalf.
- 14 (b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
- 15 amount due in connection with the loan.
- Sec. 61.9826. REALLOCATION OF MONEY. (a) In each state
- 17 fiscal year, the board shall reallocate for loan repayment
- 18 assistance under this subchapter for a particular year any money in
- 19 the physician education loan repayment program account established
- 20 under Section 61.5391 that exceeds the amount necessary in that
- 21 fiscal year for purposes of repayment assistance under Subchapter
- 22 <u>J.</u>
- 23 (b) Each year money reallocated under this section may be
- 24 used to fund loan repayment assistance for not more than 50 eligible
- 25 applicants.
- 26 (c) Any money reallocated under Subsection (a) in a fiscal
- 27 year that is not used for loan repayment assistance under this

- 1 subchapter in that fiscal year is treated as if that unused amount
- 2 had not been reallocated in that fiscal year.
- 3 Sec. 61.9827. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The board may solicit and
- 4 accept gifts and grants from any source for the purposes of this
- 5 subchapter.
- 6 Sec. 61.9828. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules as
- 7 <u>necessary to administer this subchapter.</u>
- 8 (b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
- 9 under this section and pertinent information regarding this
- 10 subchapter to:
- 11 (1) each institution of higher education and private
- 12 or independent institution of higher education;
- 13 (2) any appropriate state agency; and
- 14 (3) any appropriate professional association.
- SECTION 4. Section 61.5391(b), Education Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (b) Money in the account may not be appropriated for any
- 18 purpose except:
- 19 (1) to provide loan repayment assistance to eligible
- 20 physicians under this subchapter; or
- 21 (2) to provide loan repayment assistance under
- 22 Subchapter II if reallocated under Section 61.9826.
- 23 SECTION 5. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 24 shall adopt the rules for loan repayment assistance under
- 25 Subchapter II, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, not
- 26 later than December 1, 2013.
- 27 SECTION 6. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board

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- 1 shall adopt a common freshman admission application form for
- 2 nursing education programs as required by Section 51.762, Education
- 3 Code, as amended by this Act, not later than September 1, 2014. An
- 4 institution of higher education must accept freshman applications
- 5 for nursing education programs using the appropriate common
- 6 admission application form beginning with applicants for admission
- 7 for the 2015-2016 academic year.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
