- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 88.104, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 88.104. AUTHORITY TO ENTER PRIVATE LAND.
- 9 (a) Authority is hereby granted to every employee of the Texas
- 10 Forest Service and any outside labor or assistance the employee
- 11 deems necessary to enter upon any privately-owned land in the
- 12 performance of fire suppression duties which are by state law under
- 13 the direction of the director. These entries on privately-owned
- 14 land may be made whenever it is necessary to investigate forest and
- 15 grass fires and to ascertain whether they are burning uncontrolled,
- 16 and whenever it is necessary to suppress forest and grass fires that
- 17 are known to be burning uncontrolled.
- 18 (b) An individual providing labor or assistance to the Texas
- 19 Forest Service under Subsection (a) is not liable for civil
- 20 damages, including personal injury, wrongful death, property
- 21 damage, death, or other loss resulting from any act, error, or
- 22 omission by the individual in providing that labor or assistance
- 23 <u>unless the act, error, or omission:</u>
- 24 (1) proximately caused the loss; and

- 1 (2) was performed with malice or constitutes gross
- 2 <u>negligence</u>, recklessness, or intentional misconduct.
- 3 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 88.104, Education Code,
- 4 as added by this Act, applies only to an act, error, or omission
- 5 that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
