- 4 SECTION 1. Section 41.303, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read
- 6 as follows:

- 7 (a) The unit is governed by a board of directors composed of
- 8 each prosecuting attorney who:
- 9 <u>(1)</u> represents the state in criminal matters before a
- 10 court in a county in which one or more facilities owned or operated
- 11 by or under contract with the department or the commission are
- 12 located; and
- 13 (2) has entered into a memorandum of understanding
- 14 with the unit for the prosecution of offenses and delinquent
- 15 conduct described by Article 104.003(a), Code of Criminal
- 16 Procedure.
- 17 (c) The board of directors shall meet annually for the
- 18 purpose of electing the executive board and approving or amending
- 19 bylaws governing the unit.
- 20 <u>(d) A majority of the members of the board of directors</u>
- 21 constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The board of
- 22 directors must approve any action by a majority vote of the members
- 23 present.
- SECTION 2. Section 41.304, Government Code, is amended by

- 1 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 (b) If a vacancy on the executive board occurs before the
- 4 end of the vacating member's term, the executive board [of
- 5 directors] shall elect a person to serve the remainder of the
- 6 [vacating member's] term [in the manner provided by Subsection
- $7 + \frac{(a)}{(a)}$]. To be eligible for election under this subsection, a person
- 8 must meet any qualifications required of the vacating member for
- 9 service on the executive board.
- 10 (c) The executive board shall conduct the business of the
- 11 unit.
- 12 (d) A majority of the members of the executive board
- 13 constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The
- 14 executive board must approve any action by a majority vote of the
- 15 members present.
- SECTION 3. Subsection (d), Section 41.305, Government Code,
- 17 is amended to read as follows:
- 18 (d) If a vacancy occurs in the office of presiding officer
- 19 or assistant presiding officer before the end of the vacating
- 20 $\underline{\text{officer's term}}$, the $\underline{\text{executive}}$ board $[\underline{\text{of directors}}]$ shall elect a
- 21 person to serve the remainder of the [vacating officer's] term [in
- 22 the manner provided by Subsection (a)].
- SECTION 4. Section 41.308, Government Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 41.308. CHIEF OF SPECIAL PROSECUTION UNIT; ADDITIONAL
- 26 EMPLOYEES. The executive board [of directors], on a majority vote,
- 27 shall employ a person to serve as chief of the unit and additional

- 1 persons to accomplish the unit's purposes. The board of directors
- 2 may determine the compensation of the unit's employees.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
