A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the operation of the special prosecution unit.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 41.303, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:

- The unit is governed by a board of directors composed of (a) each prosecuting attorney who:
- (1) represents the state in criminal matters before a court in a county in which one or more facilities owned or operated by or under contract with the department or the commission are located; and
- (2) has entered into a memorandum of understanding unit for the prosecution of offenses and delinquent with the conduct described by Article 104.003(a), Code of Criminal P<u>rocedure</u>.
- (c) The board of directors shall meet annually for the purpose of electing the executive board and approving or amending
- bylaws governing the unit.
 (d) A majority of the members of the board of directors constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The board of directors must approve any action by a majority vote of the members
- SECTION 2. Section 41.304, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
- (b) If a vacancy on the executive board occurs before the of the vacating member's term, the executive board [$\frac{1}{2}$] directors] shall elect a person to serve the remainder of the [vacating member's] term [in the manner provided by Subsection (a)]. To be eligible for election under this subsection, a person must meet any qualifications required of the vacating member for service on the executive board.
- (c) The executive board shall conduct the business of the unit.
- (d) A majority of the members of the executive board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The executive board must approve any action by a majority vote of the members present.
- SECTION 3. Subsection (d), Section 41.305, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 1-57 (d) If a vacancy occurs in the office of presiding officer 1-58 or assistant presiding officer before the end of the vacating officer's term, the executive board [of directors] shall elect a person to serve the remainder of the [vacating officer's] term [in 1-59 1-60 the manner provided by Subsection (a)]. 1-61

2-3 Sec. 41.308. CHIEF OF SPECIAL PROSECUTION UNIT; ADDITIONAL
