## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to school district reports concerning corporal punishment
3	and the issuance of citations by a peace officer.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 37.0011, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
7	(e) A school district in which corporal punishment is
8	permitted as a method of student discipline shall report in each
9	district Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS)
10	submission each instance during the period covered by the
11	submission in which a district student is subject to the use of
12	corporal punishment. The report:
13	(1) must include for each instance information
14	<pre>identifying:</pre>
15	(A) the age of the student;
16	(B) the sex of the student;
17	(C) the race or ethnicity of the student; and
18	(D) whether the student is eligible for special
19	education services under Section 29.003;
20	(2) must comply with the Family Educational Rights and
21	Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g); and
22	(3) may not include personally identifiable student
23	<u>information.</u>
24	SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 37.0811 to read as follows:
- 2 <u>Sec. 37.0811.</u> REPORT REGARDING CITATIONS ON CAMPUS.
- 3 (a) In this section, "citation" means a ticket issued for a Class C
- 4 misdemeanor.
- 5 (b) The commissioner shall adopt rules requiring a school
- 6 district to report to the agency information relating to the
- 7 issuance of citations by a peace officer to students on a district
- 8 campus. The agency shall collect the reports required under this
- 9 section, compile the data, and make the data available to the
- 10 public.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
