## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to a requirement that students at an open-enrollment 1-20 charter school recite the pledges of allegiance to the United States flag and the state flag. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Subsections (b), (c), and (d), Section 25.082, Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 1-24

The board of trustees of each school district and the 1-25 (b) board of each open-enrollment charter school shall 1-26 governing 1-27 1-28 require students, once during each school day at each <u>campus</u> [school in the district], to recite:

1-29 (1) the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag 1-30 in accordance with 4 U.S.C. Section 4[, and its subsequent 1-31 amendments]; and

(2) the pledge of allegiance to the state flag in accordance with Subchapter C, Chapter 3100, Government Code. 1-32 1-33

1-34 (c) On written request from a student's parent or guardian, 1-35 a school district or open-enrollment charter school shall excuse 1-36 the student from reciting a pledge of allegiance under Subsection 1-37 (b).

1-38 The board of trustees of each school district and the (d) 1-39 governing board of each open-enrollment charter school shall provide for the observance of one minute of silence at each campus 1-40 [school in the district] following the recitation of the pledges of 1-41 1-42 allegiance to the United States and Texas flags under Subsection (b). During the one-minute period, each student may, as the student 1-43 1-44 chooses, reflect, pray, meditate, or engage in any other silent 1-45 activity that is not likely to interfere with or distract another student. Each teacher or other school employee in charge of 1-46 students during that period shall ensure that each of those students remains silent and does not act in a manner that is likely 1-47 1-48 1-49 to interfere with or distract another student.

1-50 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014 school year. 1-51

This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-52 SECTION 3. 1-53 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-54 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-55 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-56 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
