- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY AND REPORT. (a) In this section,
- 6 "commission" means the Sunset Advisory Commission.
- 7 (b) The commission shall conduct a study concerning the
- 8 self-directed semi-independent status of state agencies.
- 9 (c) The study must address:
- 10 (1) criteria and a process to be used in determining
- 11 whether a state agency should be given self-directed
- 12 semi-independent status;
- 13 (2) criteria and a process to be used in determining
- 14 whether the self-directed semi-independent status of a state agency
- 15 should be revoked;
- 16 (3) measures to ensure adequate state oversight of
- 17 state agencies with self-directed semi-independent status;
- 18 (4) reporting requirements for state agencies with
- 19 self-directed semi-independent status;
- 20 (5) procedures for a state agency with self-directed
- 21 semi-independent status to contract with and to pay for services
- 22 received from another state agency;
- 23 (6) review of a state agency's self-directed
- 24 semi-independent status as part of the agency's sunset review;

- 1 (7) appropriations issues related to a state agency's
- 2 transition to self-directed semi-independent status;
- 3 (8) appropriations issues related to a state agency's
- 4 transition from self-directed semi-independent status to regular
- 5 state agency status; and
- 6 (9) criteria to review complaint procedures and the
- 7 disposition of complaints by a state agency with self-directed
- 8 semi-independent status.
- 9 (d) In conducting the study, the commission shall consult
- 10 with the Legislative Budget Board.
- 11 (e) At the commission's request, a state agency shall
- 12 provide information and assistance to the commission in conducting
- 13 the study under this section.
- 14 (f) Not later than August 31, 2014, the commission shall
- 15 submit a report on the commission's findings and recommendations
- 16 to:
- 17 (1) the governor;
- 18 (2) the lieutenant governor; and
- 19 (3) each member of the legislature.
- 20 (g) This section expires September 1, 2015.
- 21 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 22 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 23 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 24 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 25 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
