Section 822.101, Health and Safety Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Subdivision (8) to read as follows: 6 (8) "Wildlife sanctuary" means a public charitable 7 organization that: (A) is exempt from taxation under Section 501(a), 8 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed as an exempt 9 organization under Section 501(c)(3) of that code; 10 11 (B) is described by Section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi), 12 Internal Revenue Code of 1986; 13 (C) operates a place of refuge where an abused, 14 neglected, unwanted, impounded, abandoned, orphaned, or displaced wild animal is: 15 16 (i) provided care for the animal's lifetime; 17 18 (ii) transferred to another wildlife 19 sanctuary; or (iii) released back to the animal's natural 20 21 habitat; and 22 (D) with respect to a wild animal owned by the 23 organization, does not: 24 (i) conduct any commercial activity; or

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(ii) breed the animal.

2 SECTION 2. Section 822.102, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to 4 read as follows:

5 (a) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (c), this
6 [This] subchapter does not apply to:

7 (1) a county, municipality, or agency of the state or
8 an agency of the United States or an agent or official of a county,
9 municipality, or agency acting in an official capacity;

10 (2) a research facility, as that term is defined by 11 Section 2(e), Animal Welfare Act (7 U.S.C. Section 2132), and its 12 subsequent amendments, that is licensed by the secretary of 13 agriculture of the United States under that Act;

14 (3) an organization that is an accredited member of
 15 the [American Zoo and Aquarium] Association of Zoos and Aquariums;

16 (4) an injured, infirm, orphaned, or abandoned 17 dangerous wild animal while being transported for care or 18 treatment;

a sick, [an] injured, 19 (5) infirm, orphaned, or abandoned dangerous wild animal while being rehabilitated or $[\tau]$ 20 treated[, or cared for] by and in the temporary possession of a 21 licensed veterinarian[, an incorporated humane society or animal 22 shelter,] or a person who holds a rehabilitation permit issued 23 under Subchapter C, Chapter 43, Parks and Wildlife Code, for the 24 animal being rehabilitated or treated; 25

26 (6) a dangerous wild animal owned by and in the custody27 and control of a transient circus company that is not based in this

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2 (A) the animal is used as an integral part of the3 circus performances; and

4 (B) the animal is kept within this state only
5 during the time the circus is performing in this state or for a
6 period not to exceed 30 days while the circus is performing outside

8 (7) a dangerous wild animal while in the temporary 9 custody or control of a television or motion picture production 10 company during the filming of a television or motion picture 11 production in this state;

12 (8) a dangerous wild animal owned by and in the 13 possession, custody, or control of a college or university solely 14 as a mascot for the college or university;

(9) a dangerous wild animal while being transported in interstate commerce through the state in compliance with the Animal Welfare Act (7 U.S.C. Section 2131 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments and the regulations adopted under that Act;

19 (10) a nonhuman primate owned by and in the control and custody of a person whose only business is supplying nonhuman 20 primates directly and exclusively to biomedical research 21 22 facilities and who holds a Class "A" or Class "B" dealer's license issued by the secretary of agriculture of the United States under 23 24 the Animal Welfare Act (7 U.S.C. Section 2131 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments; 25

26 (11) a dangerous wild animal that is:

(A) owned by or in the possession, control, or

No. 1395 1 custody of a person who is a participant in a species survival plan of the [American Zoo and Aquarium] Association of Zoos and 2 3 Aquariums for that species; and 4 (B) an integral part of that species survival 5 plan; [and] 6 (12) in a county west of the Pecos River that has a 7 population of less than 25,000, a cougar, bobcat, or coyote in the 8 possession, custody, or control of a person that has trapped the cougar, bobcat, or coyote as part of a predator or depredation 9 10 control activity; (13) an organization that is an accredited member of 11 12 the Zoological Association of America; and (14) a wildlife sanctuary that is verified or 13 accredited by: 14 15 (A) the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries; 16 (B) the American Sanctuary Association; or 17 (C) a successor nonprofit organization that is similar to the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries or the 18 19 American Sanctuary Association and is designated by the Department of State Health Services if the Global Federation of Animal 20 Sanctuaries or the American Sanctuary Association ceases to exist. 21 (c) Section 822.1025 applies to an organization described 22 by Subsection (a)(13) and a wildlife sanctuary described by 23 24 Subsection (a)(14). SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 822, Health and Safety 25 Code, is amended by adding Section 822.1025 to read as follows: 26 Sec. 822.1025. DUTIES OF CERTAIN ENTITIES. (a) In this 27

1 section, "department" means the Department of State Health 2 Services. 3 (b) Not later than December 31 of each year, an organization described by Section 822.102(a)(13) or a wildlife sanctuary 4 5 described by Section 822.102(a)(14) shall provide to the animal registration agency and the department: 6 7 (1) an annual notification, on a form provided by the department, that includes: 8 9 (A) the name, address, and telephone number of 10 the organization or sanctuary; (B) a complete identification of each dangerous 11 12 wild animal in the custody and control of the organization or sanctuary, including species, sex, and age, if known; and 13 14 (C) the exact location where each animal is to be 15 kept; and 16 (2) a written, notarized certification from the 17 organization or sanctuary that the organization or sanctuary holds a current verification or accreditation and is complying with the 18 19 standards of the verification or accreditation organization for: (A) possession and confinement of each dangerous 20 wild animal; 21 22 (B) facilities and operations; 23 (C) animal health and husbandry; and 24 (D) veterinary care. (c) Not later than the 15th business day after the date on 25 26 which an organization described by Section 822.102(a)(13) or a wildlife sanctuary described by Section 822.102(a)(14) acquires a 27

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dangerous wild animal, the organization or sanctuary shall provide 1 2 to the animal registration agency and the department an update to the annual notification described by Subsection (b)(1). 3 4 (d) The animal registration agency may establish and charge a reasonable fee for the annual notification under this section to 5 recover the costs associated with the administration and 6 enforcement of this section. The fee under this subsection may not 7 8 exceed \$50 for each animal listed in the annual notification and may not exceed \$500, regardless of the number of animals listed in the 9 10 annual notification. (e) Sections 822.107 and 822.110 apply to an organization 11 12 described by Section 822.102(a)(13) or a wildlife sanctuary described by Section 822.102(a)(14). 13 14 (f) An organization described by Section 822.102(a)(13) or 15 a wildlife sanctuary described by Section 822.102(a)(14) that: 16 (1) violates Subsections (b)-(d) is subject to Sections 822.113-822.115 as if the organization or sanctuary had 17 violated Section 822.103(a); or 18 19 (2) violates Subsection (e) is subject to Sections 822.113 and 822.115, as applicable. 20 21 SECTION 4. (a) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (b) of this section, each animal registration agency in this state 22 and the Department of State Health Services shall establish 23 24 procedures to comply with Section 822.1025, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than December 1, 2013. 25

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(b) An animal registration agency is not required to27 establish procedures under Subsection (a) of this section if the

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1 municipality or county in which the agency is located prohibits the 2 ownership, possession, or confinement of dangerous wild animals as 3 defined by Section 822.101, Health and Safety Code.

4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
