AN ACT

2 relating to authorizing certain persons to file documents

3 electronically for recording with a county clerk.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Section 195.003, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
- 7 read as follows:

- 8 (a) The following persons may file electronic documents or
- 9 other documents electronically for recording with a county clerk
- 10 that accepts electronic filing and recording under this chapter:
- 11 (1) an attorney licensed in this state;
- 12 (2) a bank, savings and loan association, savings
- 13 bank, or credit union doing business under laws of the United States
- 14 or this state;
- 15 (3) a federally chartered lending institution, a
- 16 federal government-sponsored entity, an instrumentality of the
- 17 federal government, or a person approved as a mortgagee by the
- 18 United States to make federally insured loans;
- 19 (4) a person licensed to make regulated loans in this
- 20 state;
- 21 (5) a title insurance company or title insurance agent
- 22 licensed to do business in this state; [or]
- 23 (6) an agency of this state; or
- 24 (7) a municipal clerk.

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- 1 (a-1) In addition to persons listed under Subsection (a), a
 2 county may authorize a person to file electronic documents or other
 3 documents electronically for recording with a county clerk if the
 4 county enters into a memorandum of understanding with the person
 5 for that purpose. This subsection applies only to a county with a
 6 population of 500,000 or more.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
