- 9 juvenile probation department is considered to be a governmental

- 11 (b) For purposes of Chapter 101, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 12 Code, an employee of a juvenile probation department is considered
- 13 to be an employee of a governmental unit of the state government.
- 14 (c) For purposes of Chapter 104, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 15 Code, an employee of a juvenile probation department is considered
- 16 to be an employee of a state agency.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 152, Human Resources Code,
- 18 is amended by adding Section 152.00125 to read as follows:
- Sec. 152.00125. GOVERNMENTAL LIABILITY. (a) For purposes
- 20 of Subchapter B, Chapter 101, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, a
- 21 juvenile board is considered to be a governmental unit of the state
- 22 government.

- 3 (c) For purposes of Chapter 104, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 4 Code, a juvenile board member or employee of a juvenile board is
- 5 considered to be an employee of a state agency.
- 6 SECTION 3. Sections 152.0013 and 152.0014, Human Resources
- 7 Code, are repealed.
- 8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of
- 10 this Act. A cause of action that accrues before the effective date
- 11 of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that
- 12 date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
