A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of plumbing. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1301.002, Occupations Code, is amended 4 5 by amending Subdivisions (7), (11), and (12) and adding Subdivision (8-a) to read as follows: 6 (7) 7 "Plumbing" means: 8 (A) a fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or 9 piping, including a disposal system, used to: 10 (i) supply, distribute, circulate, or recirculate water, other liquid, or gas; or 11 12 (ii) eliminate sewage for a personal or 13 domestic purpose; 14 (B) а fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or piping used outside a building to connect the building to: 15 16 (i) a supply of water, other liquid, medical gases and vacuum, or other gas on the premises; or 17 18 (ii) the main in the street or alley or at the curb; 19 20 (C) а fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or 21 piping, including a drain or waste pipe, used to carry wastewater or sewage from or within a building to: 22 23 (i) a sewer service lateral at the curb or 24 in the street or alley; or

No. 1454 1 (ii) a disposal or septic terminal that 2 holds private or domestic sewage; [or] 3 (D) the installation, repair, service, or maintenance of a fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or piping 4 5 described by Paragraph (A), (B), or (C); or 6 (E) the installation, repair, and service of 7 equipment for rainwater harvesting. 8 (8-a) "Rainwater harvesting" means the capture, diversion, storage, treatment, and distribution of rainwater from a 9 roof structure for landscape irrigation, potable drinking water, or 10 nonpotable use for a personal residence or domestic use. 11 12 (11)"Water supply protection specialist" means a person who holds an endorsement issued by the board to engage in: 13 14 (A) customer service inspections, as defined by 15 rule of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality; and 16 (B) the installation, service, and repair of 17 plumbing associated with the treatment, use, and distribution use of rainwater to supply a plumbing fixture, appliance, or irrigation 18 19 system. (12) "Water treatment" means a business conducted 20 21 under contract that requires ability, experience, and skill in analyzing water to determine how to treat influent and effluent 22 23 water to change or purify the water or to add or remove minerals, 24 chemicals, or bacteria. The term does not include treatment of rainwater or the repair of systems for rainwater harvesting. 25 The 26 term includes: 27 (A) installing and servicing fixed or portable

S.B. No. 1454 1 water treatment equipment in a public or private water treatment 2 system; or 3 (B) making connections necessary to install a water treatment system. 4 5 SECTION 2. Section 1301.053(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 A person is not required to be licensed under this (a) 8 chapter to perform: 9 plumbing incidental to and in connection with the (1)10 business in which the person is employed or engaged if the person: 11 (A) is regularly employed as or acting as a 12 maintenance person or maintenance engineer; and does not engage in plumbing for the public; 13 (B) 14 (2) construction, installation, or maintenance on the 15 premises or equipment of a railroad if the person is an employee of the railroad who does not engage in plumbing for the public; 16 17 (3) plumbing if the person is engaged by a public service company to: 18 lay, maintain, or operate its service mains 19 (A) or lines to the point of measurement; and 20 21 (B) install, change, adjust, repair, remove, or renovate appurtenances, equipment, or appliances; 22 appliance installation and service work, other 23 (4) 24 than installation and service work on water heaters, that involves connecting appliances to existing openings with a code-approved 25 26 appliance connector if the person performs the work as an appliance dealer or an employee of an appliance dealer; or 27

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(5) water treatment installations, exchanges,
 services, or repairs, other than for rainwater harvesting.

3 SECTION 3. Section 1301.302, Occupations Code, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 1301.302. CONTRACT INFORMATION; REQUIRED DOCUMENTS. A written proposal, invoice, or contract relating to plumbing 6 services performed by or under the direction of a plumber licensed 7 under this chapter must contain the name and license number of the 8 responsible master plumber and the name, mailing address, and 9 telephone number of the board. The person who performed the 10 services shall give the customer an invoice or completed contract 11 document on completion of the job, regardless of whether the person 12 charged a fee for performing the services. 13

SECTION 4. Section 1301.303(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 (a) The board may investigate an alleged violation of this17 chapter by a person who:

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is licensed under this chapter; [<del>or</del>]

19 (2) is the owner of a plumbing company subject to this
20 chapter; or

21 (3) performs plumbing without holding a license under 22 this chapter.

23 SECTION 5. Section 1301.351, Occupations Code, is amended 24 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

25 (d) A person who holds a license or registration issued 26 under this chapter shall carry the license or registration on his or 27 her person while engaged in plumbing.

S.B. No. 1454 SECTION 6. Section 1301.357(e), Occupations Code, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 (e) A person is not required to hold a water supply 3 4 protection specialist endorsement if the person[+ 5 [<del>(1)</del>] is employed by: (1) [(A)] a political subdivision; or 6 7 (2) [(B)] an electric utility as defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code[; and 8 9 [(2) acts as a backflow prevention device specialist 10 or water supply protection specialist in the course of the person's employment]. 11 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 12 services performed on or after the effective date of this Act. 13 Services performed before the effective date of this Act are 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the services were 15 performed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 16 purpose. 17

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SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
