## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to college readiness and success.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 61.0517, Education Code, 5 is amended to read as follows:

6 (a) In this section, "applied STEM course" means an applied science, technology, engineering, or mathematics course offered as 7 8 part of a school district's career and technology education curriculum and approved, as provided by Section 28.027, by the 9 State Board of Education for purposes of satisfying the mathematics 10 and science curriculum requirements, including college readiness 11 standards, for the recommended high school program [imposed] under 12 13 Section 28.025(b-1)(1)(A). The term may include a course offered for dual credit. 14

SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 61.0762, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

17 (a) To implement the college readiness and success 18 strategic action plan adopted under Section 61.0761 and to enhance 19 the success of students at institutions of higher education, the 20 board by rule shall:

(1) develop <u>or identify</u> higher education bridge
programs in the subject areas of mathematics, science, social
science, or English language arts to increase student success by
reducing the need for developmental education;

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(2) develop incentive programs for institutions of
 higher education that implement research-based, innovative
 developmental education initiatives;

4 (3) develop a pilot program to award grants to 5 institutions of higher education for intensive programs designed to 6 address the needs of students at risk of dropping out of college;

7 (4) develop <u>or identify</u> professional development 8 programs for faculty of institutions of higher education on college 9 readiness standards and the implications of such standards on 10 instruction; and

11 (5) develop <u>or identify</u> other programs as determined 12 by the board that support the participation and success goals in 13 "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education<u>,</u> 14 <u>with qualifications and requirements for student participation and</u> 15 <u>institutional or public school eligibility determined by the</u> 16 <u>commissioner or the commissioner's designee.</u>

SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 61.833, Education Code,is amended to read as follows:

(b) This section applies to a student enrolled in a generalacademic teaching institution who:

(1) transferred to the institution from or previously
attended a lower-division institution of higher education;

(2) earned at least 30 credit hours for course work
successfully completed at the lower-division institution of higher
education; and

(3) has earned a cumulative total of at least <u>66</u> [<del>90</del>]
credit hours for course work successfully completed.

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1	SECTION 4.	Subsection (d), Section 61.0761, Education Code,
2	is repealed.	
3	SECTION 5.	This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
