A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to college readiness and success.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 61.0517(a), Education Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) In this section, "applied STEM course" means an applied
- 7 science, technology, engineering, or mathematics course offered as
- 8 part of a school district's career and technology education
- 9 curriculum and approved, as provided by Section 28.027, by the
- 10 State Board of Education for purposes of satisfying the mathematics
- 11 and science curriculum requirements, including college readiness
- 12 standards, for the recommended high school program [imposed] under
- 13 Section 28.025(b-1)(1)(A). The term may include a course offered
- 14 for dual credit.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.0762(a), Education Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (a) To implement the college readiness and success
- 18 strategic action plan adopted under Section 61.0761 and to enhance
- 19 the success of students at institutions of higher education, the
- 20 board by rule shall:
- 21 (1) develop or identify higher education bridge
- 22 programs in the subject areas of mathematics, science, social
- 23 science, or English language arts to increase student success by
- 24 reducing the need for developmental education;

- 1 (2) develop incentive programs for institutions of
- 2 higher education that implement research-based, innovative
- 3 developmental education initiatives;
- 4 (3) develop a pilot program to award grants to
- 5 institutions of higher education for intensive programs designed to
- 6 address the needs of students at risk of dropping out of college;
- 7 (4) develop or identify professional development
- 8 programs for faculty of institutions of higher education on college
- 9 readiness standards and the implications of such standards on
- 10 instruction; and
- 11 (5) develop <u>or identify</u> other programs as determined by
- 12 the board that support the participation and success goals in
- 13 "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education,
- 14 with qualifications and requirements for student participation and
- 15 institutional or public school eligibility determined by the
- 16 <u>commissioner or the commissioner's designee</u>.
- SECTION 3. Section 61.833(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (b) This section applies to a student enrolled in a general
- 20 academic teaching institution who:
- 21 (1) transferred to the institution from or previously
- 22 attended a lower-division institution of higher education;
- 23 (2) earned at least 30 credit hours for course work
- 24 successfully completed at the lower-division institution of higher
- 25 education; and
- 26 (3) has earned a cumulative total of at lease 66 [90]
- 27 credit hours for course work successfully completed.
