5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 39.0545 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 39.0545. EVALUATING DROPOUT RECOVERY SCHOOLS.
9	(a) For purposes of evaluating performance under Section
10	39.053(c), the commissioner shall designate as a dropout recovery
11	school a school district or an open-enrollment charter school or a
12	campus of a district or of an open-enrollment charter school:
13	(1) that serves students in grades 9 through 12 and has
14	an enrollment of which at least 50 percent of the students are 17
15	years of age or older as of September 1 of the school year as
16	reported for the fall semester Public Education Information
17	Management System (PEIMS) submission; and
18	(2) that meets the eligibility requirements for and is
19	registered under alternative education accountability procedures
20	adopted by the commissioner.
21	(b) Notwithstanding Section 39.053(c)(2), the commissioner
22	shall use the alternative completion rate under this subsection to
23	determine the student achievement indicator under Section
24	39.053(c)(2) for a dropout recovery school. The alternative

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1 completion rate shall be the ratio of the total number of students
2 who graduate, continue attending school into the next academic
3 year, or receive a high school equivalency certificate to the total
4 number of students in the longitudinal cohort of students.

5 (c) Notwithstanding Section 39.053(c)(2), in determining 6 the performance rating under Section 39.054 of a dropout recovery 7 school, the commissioner shall include any student described by 8 Section 39.053(g-1) who graduates or receives a high school 9 equivalency certificate.

10 (d) For a dropout recovery school, only the best result from 11 the primary administration and any retake of an assessment 12 instrument administered to a student in the school year evaluated 13 under the accountability procedures adopted by the commissioner may 14 be considered in determining the performance rating of the school 15 under Section 39.054.

SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
