14	(b) The committee, in collaboration with the Texas Higher
15	Education Coordinating Board, shall conduct a study to identify

18	state or federal funds.
19	(c) The study must include an evaluation of the
20	accessibility of resources and information, whether printed or

- 4 (d) The committee shall include the results of the study and
- 5 any recommendations for legislative or administrative action in the
- 6 report submitted to the governor and the legislature under Section
- 7 <u>115.009(3) before December 31, 2014.</u>
- 8 <u>(e) This section expires September 1, 2015.</u>
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
