each state agency shall submit a copy of the agency's information

security plan to the department.
(d) Each state agency's information security plan is

confidential and exempt from disclosure under Chapter 552.

SECTION 2. Not later than October 15, 2014, each state agency shall develop and submit the information security plan required by Section 2054.133, Government Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
