1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the development of state agency information security
 1-20 plans.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
 1-23 amended by adding Section 2054.133 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 2054.133. INFORMATION SECURITY PLAN. (a) Each state
 1-25 agency shall develop, and periodically update, an information
 1-26 security plan for protecting the security of the agency's
 1-27 information.

1-28 (b) In developing the plan, the state agency shall:

1-29 (1) consider any vulnerability report prepared under
 1-30 Section 2054.077 for the agency;

1-31 (2) incorporate the network security services
 1-32 provided by the department to the agency under Chapter 2059;

1-33 (3) identify and define the responsibilities of agency
 1-34 staff who produce, access, use, or serve as custodians of the
 1-35 agency's information;

1-36 (4) identify risk management and other measures taken
 1-37 to protect the agency's information from unauthorized access,
 1-38 disclosure, modification, or destruction;

1-39 (5) include:

1-40 (A) the best practices for information security
 1-41 developed by the department; or

1-42 (B) a written explanation of why the best
 1-43 practices are not sufficient for the agency's security; and

1-44 (6) omit from any written copies of the plan
 1-45 information that could expose vulnerabilities in the agency's
 1-46 network or online systems.

1-47 (c) Not later than October 15 of each even-numbered year,
 1-48 each state agency shall submit a copy of the agency's information
 1-49 security plan to the department.

1-50 (d) Each state agency's information security plan is
 1-51 confidential and exempt from disclosure under Chapter 552.

1-52 SECTION 2. Not later than October 15, 2014, each state
 1-53 agency shall develop and submit the information security plan
 1-54 required by Section 2054.133, Government Code, as added by this
 1-55 Act.

1-56 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
