## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of pain management services. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 3 Δ SECTION 1. Section 168.002, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 Sec. 168.002. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to: 7 (1)a medical or dental school or an outpatient clinic associated with a medical or dental school; 8 a hospital, including any outpatient facility or 9 (2) clinic of a hospital; 10 a hospice established under 40 T.A.C. Section 11 (3) 12 97.403 or defined by 42 C.F.R. Section 418.3; 13 (4) a facility maintained or operated by this state; 14 (5) a clinic maintained or operated by the United 15 States; (6) a health organization certified by the board under 16 17 Section 162.001; (7) a clinic owned or operated by a physician who 18 treats patients within the physician's area of specialty and who 19 personally uses other forms of treatment, including surgery, with 20 21 the issuance of a prescription for a majority of the patients; or 22 (8) a clinic owned or operated by an advanced practice 23 nurse licensed in this state who treats patients in the nurse's area 24 of specialty and who personally uses other forms of treatment with

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the issuance of a prescription for a majority of the patients <u>in</u>
 <u>compliance with rules adopted by the Texas Board of Nursing</u>.

3 SECTION 2. Section 168.102, Occupations Code, is amended by 4 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

5 (d) If an applicant for a certificate under this chapter is 6 under investigation by the board for a violation of this subtitle, 7 board rules, or other law relating to the prescription, 8 dispensation, administration, supply, or sale of a controlled 9 substance, the board may not make a decision on the application 10 until the board has reached a final decision on the matter under 11 investigation.

SECTION 3. Section 168.201, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

14 (d) A person who owns or operates a pain management clinic
 15 is engaged in the practice of medicine.

SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 168.202, Occupations
Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A violation of this chapter or a rule adopted under this
chapter is grounds for disciplinary action, including a temporary
<u>suspension or restriction under Section 164.059</u>, against a pain
management clinic certified under this chapter or an owner or
operator of a clinic certified under this chapter.

23 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
24 amended by adding Section 301.1546 to read as follows:

25 <u>Sec. 301.1546. RULES REGARDING PAIN MANAGEMENT. The board</u>
26 shall adopt rules regarding the provision of pain management
27 services by advanced practice nurses.

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1 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 2 168.002, Occupations Code, apply only to services provided by a 3 physician or advanced practice nurse on or after the effective date 4 of this Act. Services provided before the effective date of this 5 Act are governed by the law in effect when the services were 6 provided, and the former law is continued in effect for that 7 purpose.

SECTION 7. Subsection (d), Section 168.102, Occupations 8 9 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an application for a 10 certificate for a pain management clinic filed with the Texas Medical Board on or after the effective date of this Act. 11 An application for a certificate for a pain management clinic filed 12 before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the 13 application was filed, and that law is continued in effect for that 14 15 purpose.

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SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
