SECTION 1. Section 168.002, Occupations Code, is amended to

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- Sec. 168.002. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to: 6
- 7 (1) a medical or dental school or an outpatient clinic
- associated with a medical or dental school; 8
- 9 (2) a hospital, including any outpatient facility or

- 11 a hospice established under 40 T.A.C. Section
- 97.403 or defined by 42 C.F.R. Section 418.3; 12
- (4) a facility maintained or operated by this state; 13
- 14 (5) a clinic maintained or operated by the United

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- a health organization certified by the board under 16
- Section 162.001; 17
- 18 (7) a clinic owned or operated by a physician who
- treats patients within the physician's area of specialty and who 19
- 20 uses other forms of treatment, including surgery, with the issuance
- of a prescription for a majority of the patients; or 21
- 22 (8) a clinic owned or operated by an advanced practice
- 23 nurse licensed in this state who treats patients in the nurse's area
- of specialty and uses other forms of treatment with the issuance of 24

- 1 a prescription for a majority of the patients <u>in compliance with</u>
- 2 rules adopted by the Texas Board of Nursing.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 168.102, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 5 (d) If an applicant for a certificate under this chapter is
- 6 under investigation by the board for a violation of this subtitle,
- 7 board rules, or other law relating to the prescription,
- 8 <u>dispensation</u>, administration, supply, or sale of a controlled
- 9 substance, the board may not make a decision on the application
- 10 until the board has reached a final decision on the matter under
- 11 <u>investigation</u>.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 168.201, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 13 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 14 (d) A person who owns or operates a pain management clinic
- 15 is engaged in the practice of medicine.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 301.1546 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 301.1546. RULES REGARDING PAIN MANAGEMENT. The board
- 19 may adopt rules regarding the provision of pain management services
- 20 by advanced practice nurses.
- 21 SECTION 5. Section 168.102(d), Occupations Code, as added
- 22 by this Act, applies only to an application for a certificate for a
- 23 pain management clinic filed with the Texas Medical Board on or
- 24 after the effective date of this Act. An application for a
- 25 certificate for a pain management clinic filed before that date is
- 26 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed,
- 27 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
