SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 2-12 168.002, Occupations Code, apply only to services provided by a physician or advanced practice nurse on or after the effective date 2-13 of this Act. Services provided before the effective date of this 2-14 2**-**15 2**-**16 Act are governed by the law in effect when the services were provided, and the former law is continued in effect for that 2-17 purpose.

SECTION 7.
