A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT

- 2 relating to cooperation with federal agencies on immigration issues
- 3 in this state; authorizing fees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 751, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER C. COOPERATION WITH FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR
- 8 IMMIGRATION ISSUES
- 9 Sec. 751.051. BORDER SECURITY. The office, in consultation
- 10 with the Department of Public Safety, shall seek to enter into a
- 11 memorandum of understanding or other agreement with the appropriate
- 12 federal agency to implement a border security strategy in this
- 13 state. The border security strategy requested may include, subject
- 14 to the receipt of federal aid or funding:
- 15 (1) an increase in the number of federal border
- 16 officers working on the Texas-Mexico border;
- 17 (2) strategic fencing in certain urban areas near the
- 18 Texas-Mexico border;
- 19 (3) increased land and sea border patrols;
- 20 (4) flights of unmanned aerial vehicles to monitor
- 21 border activity;
- 22 (5) use of infrared cameras and other technology to
- 23 assist in identifying persons attempting to cross the border
- 24 illegally;

- 1 (6) continued communication and cooperation with
- 2 federal law enforcement authorities; and
- 3 (7) improved extradition agreements with Mexico and
- 4 other countries.
- 5 Sec. 751.052. GUEST WORKER PROGRAM. The office, in
- 6 consultation with the Texas Workforce Commission, shall seek to
- 7 enter into a memorandum of understanding or other agreement with
- 8 the appropriate federal agency to authorize or grant a waiver for a
- 9 pilot guest worker program to be implemented in order to bring
- 10 skilled and unskilled workers into this state during periods of
- 11 time when no Texan workers are available to fill open employment
- 12 positions. The proposed pilot program would:
- 13 (1) be self-funding through participation fees and
- 14 fines;
- 15 (2) require applicants to:
- 16 (A) pass a criminal background check;
- 17 (B) show some proficiency in the English
- 18 language; and
- 19 (C) submit proof of health insurance coverage
- 20 provided by the applicant's employer or purchased by the applicant;
- 21 (3) limit participation to employers that deduct and
- 22 match payroll taxes; and
- 23 (4) provide for an identification card for program
- 24 participants that would assist in monitoring any criminal and civil
- 25 court appearances.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
