- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "office" means the
- 6 General Land Office.
- 7 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The office shall conduct a study
- 8 regarding:
- 9 (1) the authority of federal, state, and local
- 10 governmental entities to create a line of dunes on privately and
- 11 publicly owned portions of the Gulf Coast to protect gulf beaches
- 12 from storm surge damage;
- 13 (2) the effect of state statutes, rules, and court
- 14 decisions on the ability of governmental entities and owners of
- 15 beachfront property to protect gulf beaches from storm surge
- 16 damage;
- 17 (3) financial resources available to support the
- 18 creation of storm surge dunes;
- 19 (4) the costs and benefits of creating storm surge
- 20 dunes; and
- 21 (5) the costs and benefits of the granting by owners of
- 22 beachfront property to governmental entities of easements for the
- 23 creation of storm surge dunes.
- 24 (b) The office may contract with any appropriate person to

- 1 assist the office in conducting the study under this section.
- 2 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2014, the
- 3 office shall report the results of the study conducted under this
- 4 Act to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 5 house of representatives, and the standing committees in the senate
- 6 and the house of representatives that have primary jurisdiction
- 7 over natural resources. The report may include the office's
- 8 recommendations for legislation to address any areas of concern.
- 9 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires August 31, 2015.
- 10 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 11 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 12 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 13 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 14 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
