1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the creation of an advisory committee to examine the  
 1-20 fingerprinting practices of juvenile probation departments.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. FINGERPRINTING ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Not later  
 1-23 than December 1, 2013, the Texas Juvenile Justice Board shall  
 1-24 appoint an advisory committee to develop a plan to end the practice  
 1-25 of fingerprinting children referred to a juvenile probation  
 1-26 department for delinquent conduct, other than felony conduct. The  
 1-27 plan must ensure that public safety and due process rights are  
 1-28 protected.

1-29 SECTION 2. APPOINTMENTS; PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) In making  
 1-30 appointments to the advisory committee, the board shall include  
 1-31 members who are interested parties, including:

- 1-32 (1) chief juvenile probation officers;
- 1-33 (2) juvenile prosecutors;
- 1-34 (3) juvenile defense attorneys;
- 1-35 (4) peace officers;
- 1-36 (5) representatives of the Department of Family and  
 1-37 Protective Services;
- 1-38 (6) juvenile justice advocates; and
- 1-39 (7) members of the public.

1-40 (b) The board shall designate one of the members as  
 1-41 presiding officer of the advisory committee.

1-42 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2014, the  
 1-43 advisory committee shall submit to the board the plan developed  
 1-44 under Section 1.

1-45 SECTION 4. COMPENSATION. Members of the advisory committee  
 1-46 serve without compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement  
 1-47 for expenses.

1-48 SECTION 5. APPLICATION OF LAWS GOVERNING ADVISORY  
 1-49 COMMITTEES. The advisory committee is not subject to Chapter 2110,  
 1-50 Government Code.

1-51 SECTION 6. EXPIRATION DATE. The advisory committee is  
 1-52 abolished and this Act expires January 1, 2015.

1-53 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect  
 1-54 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members  
 1-55 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas  
 1-56 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for  
 1-57 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
